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26	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
27	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the State of Arkansas will
28	likely be the recipient of a large amount of federal funding directly
29	allocated for the provision and installation of reliable and affordable
30	broadband that is predicated on the review of maps and the current status of
31	broadband deployment in the State of Arkansas; that the Federal
32	Communications Commission has authorized a review of mapping of broadband
33	assets for each state and there is a short timeline to be met in the
34	furtherance of the state's response to the Federal Communications Commission;
35	and that this act is immediately necessary to provide for the research and
36	assessment regarding the state's broadband coverage and needs, which coverage

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1	is directly related to the public health, welfare, and safety of the citizens
2	of the State of Arkansas. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and
3	this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public
4	peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:
5	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
6	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
7	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
8	bill; or
9	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
10	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
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
