1 (b) The administrative functions of the entities under subsection (a)
2 of this section are transferred by a cabinet-level department transfer under
3 § 25-43-202 to the Department of Agriculture.

(c) The statutory authority, powers, duties, functions, records,

personnel, property, and unexpended balances of appropriations, allocations,

or other funds of the entities under subsection (a) of this section,

including the functions of budgeting or purchasing, are transferred to the

Department of Agriculture.

(d)(1) The transfer of the entities in subsection (a) of this section does not affect the orders, rules, regulations, directives, or standards made or promulgated by the entities in subsection (a) of this section before the effective date of this act.

(2) The orders, rules, regulations, directives, or standards under subdivision (d)(1) of this section shall continue with full force and effect until amended or repealed under authority given by law.

(e) The members of the entities in subsection (a) of this section, and their successors, shall continue to be selected in the manner and serve for the terms provided by the statutes applicable to the entities in subsection (a) of this section.

(f) The entities in subsection (a) of this section and Arkansas Farm

Bureau Federation shall grant access to and provide all information requested

by the Department of Agriculture to accomplish the transfer and mission of

the entities in subsection (a) of this section.

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 2-9-103 is amended to read as follows: 2-9-103. Arkansas Catfish Promotion Board.

(a)(1) The Arkansas Catfish Promotion Board is created.

(2) The board shall be composed of seven (7) members appointed by the *Governor*, confirmed by the Senate, as follows:

(1)(A) The Catfish Farmers of Arkansas, Inc., shall submit to the Governor the names of six (6) persons who are members of the catfish industry. The list of nominees shall include commercial catfish producers, processors, and feed dealers identified as such. The Arkansas Farm Bureau Federation shall submit to the Governor the names of six (6) persons who are commercial catfish producers. All members shall be and who are residents of Arkansas.

2	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the Arkansas Catfish Promotion

4	Board, Arkansas Wheat Promotion Board, Arkansas Corn and Grain Sorghum
5	Promotion Board, and Arkansas Beef Council preserves the public peace,
6	health, and safety by studying, planning, promoting, and implementing needed
7	projects and research to support the agricultural industry in Arkansas; that
8	this act provides for the transfer of agricultural boards to the Department
9	of Agriculture for more efficient agricultural promotion and industry in the
10	state; and that this act should become effective on July 1, 2023, to coincide
11	with the appropriation bills of the Department of Agriculture and Department
12	of Finance and Administration to continue to provide the vital services of
13	these state entities as the transfer is implemented and does not experience
14	any issues with funding under the transfer. Therefore, an emergency is
15	declared to exist, and this act being necessary for the preservation of the
16	public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on July 1, 2023.
