26 SECTION 23. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. 9 SECTION 25. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the 10 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits 11 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2023 is essential to the operation of 12 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in 13 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the 14 15 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2023 could work irreparable harm 16 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental 17 programs.
