1	(2) A judge or justice who forfeits his or her rights to
2	retirement benefits under § 24-8-215(c) is not required to continue to pay
3	contributions to the system.
4	(b) (1) In the event a judge or justice ceases to be a member prior to
5	qualifying for retirement benefits, he or she shall be entitled to a refund
6	of all contributions paid by him or her into the system.
7	(2)(A) In the event a judge or justice forfeits his or her
8	rights to retirement benefits under § 24-8-215(c), the judge or justice is
9	entitled to receive the principal of the balance of his or her contributions
10	to the system.
11	(B) A judge or justice who forfeited his or her rights to
12	retirement benefits under § 24-8-215(c) is not entitled to any interest
13	accumulated from his or her contributions to the system.
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15	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 24-8-706(a), concerning the contribution
16	rate of members under the Tier Two Actual Judicial Service Benefit Plan, is
17	amended to read as follows:
18	(a) (1) The contribution of each member of the Tier Two Actual Judicial
19	Service Benefit Plan for the Arkansas Judicial Retirement System shall be
20	five percent (5%) of each member's annual salary.
21	(2)(A) A judge or justice who forfeits his or her rights to
22	retirement benefits under § 24-8-710(b) is not required to continue to pay
23	contributions to the system.
24	(B) In the event a judge or justice forfeits his or her
25	rights to retirement benefits under § 24-8-215(c), the judge or justice is
26	entitled to receiving the principal of the balance of his or her
27	contributions to the system.
28	(C) A judge or justice who forfeited his or her rights to
29	retirement benefits under § 24-8-215(c) is not entitled to any interest
30	accumulated from his or her contributions to the system.
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32	SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
33	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that certain provisions of the
34	Arkansas Code concerning the Arkansas Judicial Retirement System, a state
35	retirement plan created by the General Assembly for the purpose of providing
36	retirement benefits to judges and justices of the state are in need of

1	revision to conform to sound public pension policy; that the Arkansas
2	Judicial Retirement System operates through a fiscal year of July 1 to June
3	30; that having a July 1, 2023 effective date is necessary to allow the
4	provisions within this act to begin on the first day of the fiscal year in
5	order to provide proper administration of the procedures within this act;
6	that these revisions are of importance for actuarial purposes and to protect
7	the benefits to members of the Arkansas Judicial Retirement System; and that
8	the effect of this act is necessary in order to maintain an orderly system of
9	benefits for the members of the Arkansas Judicial Retirement System.
10	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being necessary
11	for the preservation of public peace, health, and safety shall become
12	effective on July 1, 2023.
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
