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20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:			
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22	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 20-22-1011(a), concerning fire drills, is			
23	amended to remove language that is inconsistent with Arkansas Code § $6-21-121$			
24	requiring exterior school	l doors to be closed and locked:		
25	(a) It shall be th	ne duty of the State Fire Marshal,	or his or her	
26	designee, to require tead	chers of public and private schools	s and all

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30	SECTION 2. EMERGEN	NCY CLAUSE. It is found and determ	nined by the	
31	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that Arkansas law is currently			
32	inconsistent and unclear regarding the duty to keep exterior school doors			
33	closed and locked; that keeping exterior school doors closed and locked			
34	impacts the public peace, health, and safety by keeping schools safe from			
35	unwanted entry and protec	cting the safety and welfare of stu	udents and	
36	teachers; and that this act is immediately necessary to ensure that school			

T	buildings offer the intended protections for the students and teachers of the		
2	state. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being		
3	immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and		
4	safety shall become effective on:		
5	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
6	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
7	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
8	bill; or		
9	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
10	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.		
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
