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11 SECTION 66. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 12 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER PROCEDURES - PERSONAL SERVICES EXTRA HELP. In the event that there is not 13 14 sufficient appropriation provided for by the General Assembly for payment of 15 personal services related to Extra Help for any state agency for the period 16 ending June 30, <del>2025</del> 2026, said agency may request a transfer from 17 appropriations provided for Personal Services Extra Help in the Miscellaneous 18 Transfers Section herein, from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, stating 19 clearly the amount required. Upon approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of 20 the State, and after seeking prior review by the Arkansas Legislative Council 21 or Joint Budget Committee, the State Auditor shall be notified as to the 22 amount and the purposes for which said appropriation is to be made. The 23 appropriation shall then be established upon the books of the Department of 24 Finance and Administration and the State Auditor. Provided further, that if 25 desired, said appropriation shall be supplemental to those regularly appropriated for such purposes by the General Assembly for the agency. 26 27 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2024 28 2025 through June 30, <del>2025</del> 2026.

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30 SECTION 67. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 31 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 32 INTRASTATE METRO PLANNING GRANTS. As referenced in Section 9 of Act 637 of 33 1995, the authorized funding for Intrastate Metro Planning Grants that are 34 evenly distributed among planning and development districts under the 35 Miscellaneous Grants and Expenses Section of this Act shall include the West 36 Central Arkansas Economic Development District.

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The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2024
 2025 through June 30, 2025 2026.

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4 SECTION 68. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 5 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND 6 USAGE AUTHORIZED. The Arkansas Children's Hospital President and C.E.O. may 7 request the Department of Human Services-Division of Medical Services to 8 retain in the Department of Human Services Grant Fund account an amount not 9 to exceed \$1,000,000 for funds made available by the act to be used to match 10 federal funds used for supplemental Medicaid payments to Arkansas Children's 11 Hospital.

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15 SECTION 69. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 16 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER 17 PROCEDURES - MEDICAL MARIJUANA IMPLEMENTATION AND REGULATION. In the event 18 that sufficient appropriation is not provided by the General Assembly for 19 expenditures resulting from the implementation and regulation of the Arkansas 20 Medical Marijuana Amendment of 2016 for any state agency, pursuant to 21 Arkansas Code § 19-4-701 et seq., said agency shall request a transfer of 22 appropriation from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, stating clearly the 23 amount required. Upon approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State said 24 appropriations shall be established upon the books of the Department of 25 Finance and Administration in compliance with the applicable classifications 26 of appropriations as enumerated in Arkansas Code §§ 19-4-521 through 19-4-27 527.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,  $\frac{2024}{29}$ 29  $\frac{2025}{2025}$  through June 30,  $\frac{2025}{2026}$ .

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31 SECTION 70. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 32 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND 33 TRANSFER AUTHORITY. From time to time, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State 34 may transfer from his or her books and those of the Treasurer of State and 35 the Auditor of State from the Medical Marijuana Implementation and Operations 36 Fund to various state agencies' funds the amounts necessary to fund the

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expenses for the implementation, administration, and/or enforcement of the
 Arkansas Medical Marijuana Amendment of 2016.

3 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2024
4 2025 through June 30, 2025 2026.

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6 SECTION 71. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 7 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. BLANKET 8 BOND PROGRAM. The Secretary of the Department of Finance and Administration 9 is authorized to transfer Appropriation between the Blanket Surety Bond 10 Program appropriations authorized for State Employees (Appropriation 2DM), 11 County Employees (Appropriation 2DN), Municipal Employees (Appropriation 2DP) 12 and Public School Employees (Appropriation 2DQ).

13 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2024
14 <u>2025</u> through June 30, 2025 <u>2026</u>.

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SECTION 72. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 16 17 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER 18 PROCEDURES - VARIOUS TEMPORARY APPROPRIATION FOR STATE AGENCIES AND 19 INSTITUTIONS. (i) In the event that sufficient appropriation is not provided 20 by the General Assembly for any state agency or institution, an agency or 21 institution may request a transfer of appropriation, as provided in the 22 Various Temporary Appropriation for State Agencies and Institutions 23 Appropriation Section of this Act, from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the 24 State, stating clearly the amount requested, purpose and any additional 25 information requested by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State. 26 (ii) After reviewing a request the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State may 27 deny, modify or approve the agencies or institutions request based on the 28 estimated amount of appropriation needed and currently available, purpose, 29 estimated funding available and preferred spending priority. Upon approval 30 or modification of a request by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and 31 after meeting the requirements of subsection (iii) herein, the Department of 32 Finance and Administration shall establish the transfer of appropriation on 33 the books of the Department of Finance and Administration and the State 34 Auditor, in compliance with the applicable classifications of appropriations 35 as enumerated in Arkansas Code 19-4-521 through 19-4-525. 36 (iii) Any request approved as authorized in subsection (ii) herein,

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1 including requests that establish a new commitment item or new appropriation 2 shall require prior approval by the Arkansas Legislative Council or if 3 meeting in Regular or Fiscal Session the Joint Budget Committee. 4 Any appropriation approved as authorized in this Section shall not be (iv) 5 carried forward to the next fiscal year and shall be identified as a change 6 level increase by the state agency or institution, if requested. 7 (v) Determining the maximum amount of appropriation for a state agency or 8 institution each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly. 9 This is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the 10 appropriation act(s) for a state agency or institution. Further, the General 11 Assembly has determined that a state agency or institution may operate more 12 efficiently if some flexibility is provided to the state agency or 13 institution authorizing broad powers under this section. Therefore, it is 14 both necessary and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight 15 by requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget 16 Committee as provided by this section. 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Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. SECTION 75. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2025 is essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2025 could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2025. /s/Joint Budget Committee
