10	RAISE AWARENESS, PROMOTE EDUCATION, AND ENCOURAGE

16	TO RECOGNIZE EATING DISORDER ACTION WEEK
17	AS A TIME TO RAISE AWARENESS, PROMOTE
18	EDUCATION, AND ENCOURAGE EARLY
19	INTERVENTION AND TREATMENT FOR EATING
20	DISORDERS.

22	WHEREAS, eating disorders affect approximately nine percent (9%) of the
23	population of the United States, equating to twenty-eight million, eight
24	hundred thousand (28,800,000) citizens; and
25	
26	WHEREAS, eating disorders have the highest mortality rate of any
27	psychiatric illness, with one (1) person dying every fifty-two (52) minutes
28	as a direct consequence of an eating disorder; and
29	
30	WHEREAS, women experience eating disorders at more than two (2) times
31	the rate of men, with lifetime prevalence rates estimated at eight and six-
32	tenths percent (8.6%) for women compared to four and seven-hundredths percent
33	(4.07%) for men; and
34	
35	WHEREAS, individuals from marginalized communities, military personnel,
36	athletes, and men face unique challenges in diagnosis, treatment, and access

1 to care for eating disorders; and 2 3 WHEREAS, eating disorders show significant links with other mental health conditions including depression, anxiety, post-traumatic stress 4 5 disorder, and substance use disorders, with a high prevalence of suicidal 6 ideation and suicide attempts among those affected; and 7 8 WHEREAS, young people, including teenagers and college students, are 9 particularly vulnerable to developing disordered eating behaviors, with risk 10 factors such as dieting, body dissatisfaction, and societal pressures 11 contributing to the rise in cases; and 12 13 WHEREAS, eating disorders have a substantial economic and public health 14 impact, with Arkansas ranking thirteenth in the nation for eating disorder 15 prevalence and incurring an estimated forty-two million, four hundred 16 thousand dollars (\$42,400,000) in related healthcare costs annually; and 17 18 WHEREAS, Arkansas hospitals experience an average of two hundred 19 fifteen (215) inpatient hospitalizations and four hundred ninety-five (495) 20 emergency room visits annually due to eating disorders, further highlighting 21 the need for improved awareness, prevention, and treatment options, 22 23 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FIFTH GENERAL 24 25 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: 26 27 THAT Eating Disorder Action Week be recognized as a time to raise 28 awareness, promote education, and encourage early intervention and treatment 29 for eating disorders. 30 31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT medical professionals, educators, policymakers, 32 and community organizations work collaboratively to improve access to treatment, reduce stigma, and provide comprehensive support for individuals 33 34 affected by eating disorders. 35 36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT local, state, and national leaders take proactive
