31	known as the "jewels" of the fraternity, including Henry Arthur Callis,
32	Charles Henry Chapman, Eugene Kinckle Jones, George Biddle Kelley, Nathaniel
33	Allison Murray, Robert Harold Ogle, and Vertner Woodson Tandy; and

35	WHEREAS, Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc., initially served as a study
36	and support group for minority students who faced racial prejudice both
