18	HOMELESSNESS TO TAKE CERTAIN ACTIONS.
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20	WHEREAS, the State of Arkansas is committed to addressing homelessness
21	and housing insecurity by ensuring that housing policies and programs are
22	tailored to the unique needs of local communities and by upholding
23	accountability; and
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25	WHEREAS, the United States Government has limited the flexibility of
26	states and local governments to adopt community-specific solutions to
27	homelessness and housing insecurity by imposing complex compliance measures
28	through its Continuum of Care Interim Rule; and
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30	WHEREAS, the federally mandated Homeless Management Information System
31	places an undue administrative burden on state and local agencies that
32	reduces the ability of state and local agencies to focus on direct services
33	to the community due to the substantial data collection and reporting
34	requirements; and
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36	WHEREAS, the federal requirements under the United States Department of



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1 Housing and Urban Development's Performance Standards and Measures have 2 incentivized a one-size-fits-all approach that may not accurately reflect the 3 unique challenges faced by diverse communities or promote innovative, 4 community-based approaches to reducing homelessness; and 5 6 WHEREAS, federal policy mandates have limited the ability of local service providers to offer a range of housing and service options, which 7 8 curbs flexibility and hinders efforts to support clients with varying levels 9 of need and readiness for permanent housing; and 10 11 WHEREAS, current federal standards under the Emergency Solutions Grant 12 Program restrict local agencies from utilizing resources effectively, often 13 leading to misalignment with community-specific priorities and reducing the 14 impact of services provided to some of Arkansas's most vulnerable 15 populations; and 16 17 WHEREAS, the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act amendments of 2009 18 have resulted in a proliferation of federal mandates that limit Arkansas's 19 ability to adapt its approach to the needs of diverse populations 20 experiencing homelessness; and 21 22 WHEREAS, Permanent Supportive Housing, while essential for many 23 individuals, should not be the sole or primary solution for all experiencing 24 homelessness, and excessive reliance on Permanent Supportive Housing 25 standards has constrained Arkansas's capacity to develop diverse housing 26 solutions and funding structures; and 27 28 WHEREAS, block grant funding would allow Arkansas to better leverage 29 United States Department of Housing and Urban Development assistance by granting the state more discretion over the allocation of funds, enabling 30 31 local agencies to design programs tailored to the specific needs of 32 Arkansas's homeless and housing-insecure populations, 33 34 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FIFTH GENERAL 35 36 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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2 THAT that the House of Representatives calls upon the United States
3 Department of Housing and Urban Development and the United States Interagency
4 Council on Homelessness to:

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5 (1) Repeal the Continuum of Care Interim Rule to provide more 6 flexibility for state and local governments to design housing solutions that 7 are responsive to local conditions;

8 (2) Amend the Homeless Management Information System to 9 streamline reporting requirements, reduce administrative burdens, and allow 10 providers to direct more resources toward client services;

(3) Eliminate the United States Department of Housing and Urban
 Development performance standards and measures, allowing local governments
 and agencies the freedom to set performance indicators that more accurately
 reflect community needs and goals;

15 (4) Rescind Housing First policy mandates to permit flexibility 16 for communities to offer a variety of housing options that meet the diverse 17 needs and preferences of individuals and families experiencing homelessness;

18 (5) Reduce federal standards in the Emergency Solutions Grant
19 Program to better align with local priorities, ensuring resources are
20 effectively allocated to maximize community impact;

21 (6) Repeal the McKinney-Vento Act amendments of 2009 to decrease 22 restrictive federal mandates and increase state autonomy in addressing 23 homelessness;

(7) Reduce the United States Department of Housing and Urban
Development's role in Permanent Supportive Housing to allow local agencies
more freedom in implementing supportive housing options tailored to their
specific populations; and

(8) Shift United States Department of Housing and Urban
Development funding to block grants rather than direct assistance to enable
states to have greater flexibility in allocating funds to areas of greatest
need, allowing for a more effective response to homelessness in Arkansas.

33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT upon adoption of this resolution, a copy be 34 provided to the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development, 35 the United States Interagency Council on Homelessness, each member of the 36 Arkansas congressional delegation, and the Governor, urging their support for

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1	these changes to strengthen housing programs and better serve those
2	experiencing homelessness in Arkansas.
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
