22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:	
23		
24	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 17 is amended to add an additional	
25	chapter to read as follows:	
26	<u>CHAPTER 108</u>	
27	NATUROPATHIC PHYSICIAN PRACTICE ACT	
28		
29	$\underline{Subchapter\ l\ -\ General\ Provisions}}$	
30		
31	<u>17-108-101. Title.</u>	
32	This subchapter shall be known and may be cited as the "Naturopathic	
33	Physician Practice Act".	
34		
35	17-108-102. Legislative findings and intent.	
36	(a) The General Assembly finds that:	

1	(1) The practice of naturopathic medicine in this state affects
2	the public health, safety, and welfare and should be subject to regulation
3	and control in the public interest; and
4	(2) Naturopathic physicians comprise a distinct healthcare
5	profession that affects the public health, safety, and welfare and increases
6	freedom of choice in health care in this state.
7	(b) It is the intent of the General Assembly to ensure that
8	naturopathic physicians and the practice of naturopathic medicine as defined
9	in this subchapter merit the confidence of the public, that only qualified
10	persons be authorized to practice naturopathic medicine in this state, and
11	that a person shall not practice naturopathic medicine without a valid
12	existing license.
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14	<u>17-108-103. Definitions.</u>
15	As used in this subchapter:
16	(1) "Approved naturopathic medical school" means a medical
17	school approved by the Arkansas State Board of Naturopathy under this
18	subchapter that prepares a naturopathic physician for the practice of
19	naturopathic medicine;
20	(2) "Clinical laboratory procedure" means the use of
21	venipuncture consistent with naturopathic medical practice, commonly used
22	diagnostic modalities consistent with naturopathic practice, the recording of
23	a patient's health history, physical examination, ordering and interpretation
24	of radiographic diagnostics, and other standard imaging and examination of
25	body orifices, excluding endoscopy and colonoscopy;
26	(3) "Homeopathic medicine" means a system of medicine based on
27	the use of infinitesimal doses of substances capable of producing symptoms
28	similar to those of the disease treated, as listed in the Homeopathic
29	Pharmacopoeia of the United States;
30	(4) "Hygiene" means the use of preventive techniques, including
31	personal hygiene, asepsis, public health, and safety;
32	(5) "Laboratory examination" means:
33	(A) Phlebotomy;
34	(B) A clinical laboratory procedure;
35	(C) An orificial examination;
36	(D) A physiological function test; and

1	(E) A screening or test that is consistent with
2	naturopathic education and training;
3	(6) "Naturopathic medicine" means:
4	(A) A system of health care for the prevention, diagnosis,
5	and treatment of human health conditions, injury, and disease;
6	(B) The promotion or restoration of health; and
7	(C) The support and stimulation of a patient's inherent
8	self-healing processes through patient education and the use of naturopathic
9	therapies and therapeutic substances;
10	(7) "Naturopathic physician" means an individual licensed under
11	this subchapter as a naturopathic physician to practice naturopathic medicine
12	in this state;
13	(8) "Naturopathic therapeutic medicine" means the use of one (1)
14	or more of the following physical agents in a manner consistent with
15	naturopathic medical practice on a part or the whole of the body, by hand or
16	by mechanical means, in the resolution of a human ailment or condition:
17	<u>(A) Air;</u>
18	(B) Water;
19	<u>(C) Heat;</u>
20	<u>(D) Cold;</u>
21	<u>(E) Sound;</u>
22	<u>(F) Light;</u>
23	(G) Electromagnetism;
24	(H) Colon hydrotherapy;
25	(I) Soft tissue therapy;
26	(J) Joint mobilization;
27	(K) Therapeutic exercise; or
28	(L) Naturopathic manipulation;
29	(9) "Naturopathic therapy" means the use of:
30	(A) Naturopathic therapeutic medicine;
31	(B) Suggestion;
32	(C) Hygiene;
33	(D) A therapeutic substance;
34	(E) Nutrition and food science;
35	(F) Homeopathic medicine; or
36	(G) A clinical laboratory procedure;

1	(10) "Nutrition and food science" means the prevention and
2	treatment of disease or other human conditions through the use of food,
3	water, herbs, roots, bark, or natural food elements;
4	(11) "Professional examination" means a competency-based
5	national naturopathic physician licensing examination administered by the
6	North American Board of Naturopathic Examiners or its successor agency, which
7	nationally administers a naturopathic examination that represents federal
8	standards of education and training;
9	(12) "Suggestion" means a technique using:
10	(A) Biofeedback;
11	(B) Hypnosis;
12	(C) Health education; or
13	(D) Health counseling; and
14	(13) "Therapeutic substance" means any of the following
15	exemplified in a standard naturopathic medical text, journal, or
16	pharmacopeia:
17	(A) A vitamin;
18	(B) A mineral;
19	(C) A nutraceutical;
20	(D) A botanical medicine;
21	(E) Oxygen;
22	(F) A homeopathic medicine; or
23	(G) Other physiologic substance.
24	
25	17-108-104. Exemptions.
26	This subchapter does not prohibit or restrict:
27	(1) The practice of a healthcare profession by an individual who
28	is licensed, certified, or registered under the laws of this state and who is
29	performing services within the individual's scope of practice;
30	(2) The practice of naturopathic medicine by a student enrolled
31	in an approved naturopathic medical school if the practice of naturopathic
32	medicine by a student is performed under a course of instruction or an
33	assignment from an instructor and under the supervision of an instructor who
34	is a licensee or a duly licensed professional in the instructed field;
35	(3) A person that sells a vitamin or herb from providing
36	information about the vitamin or herb;

1	(4) The practice of naturopathic medicine by a person who is
2	licensed to practice in any other state or district in the United States and
3	who enters this state to consult with a naturopathic physician of this state
4	if the consultation is limited to examination, recommendation, or testimony
5	in litigation; or
6	(5) A person or practitioner who is not licensed as a
7	naturopathic physician from recommending ayurvedic medicine, herbal remedies,
8	nutritional advice, homeopathy, or other therapy that is within the scope of
9	practice of naturopathic medicine if that person or practitioner does not:
10	(A) Use a title protected under this subchapter;
11	(B) Represent or assume the character or appearance of a
12	licensee of this subchapter; or
13	(C) Otherwise use a name, title, or other designation that
14	indicates or implies that the person is a licensee of this subchapter.
15	
16	17-108-105. Title protection.
17	(a) A licensee shall use the title "naturopathic physician" or
18	"naturopathic doctor" and the recognized abbreviation "N.D.".
19	(b) A licensee has the exclusive right to use the following terms in
20	reference to the licensee's self:
21	(1) "Naturopathic physician";
22	(2) "Naturopathic doctor";
23	(3) "Doctor of naturopathic medicine";
24	(4) "Doctor of naturopathy";
25	(5) "N.D.";
26	<u>(6) "ND";</u>
27	<u>(7) "NMD"; and</u>
28	(8) "N.M.D.".
29	(c) An individual represents the individual's self to be a
30	naturopathic physician or a naturopathic doctor when the individual uses or
31	adopts any of the terms in subdivisions (b)(1)-(8) of this section in
32	reference to the individual's self.
33	(d)(l) An individual shall not represent the individual's self to the
34	public as a naturopathic physician, naturopathic doctor, a doctor of
35	naturopathic medicine, or a doctor of naturopathy, or as being otherwise
36	authorized to practice naturopathic medicine in the state, unless the

1	individual is licensed under this subchapter.
2	(2) An individual who is not licensed under this subchapter is
3	guilty of a Class A misdemeanor if he or she:
4	(A) Holds himself or herself out as a naturopathic
5	physician or naturopathic doctor;
6	(B) Uses any combination or abbreviation of the term
7	"naturopathic physician" or "naturopathic doctor" indicating or implying that
8	he or she is a naturopathic physician or naturopathic doctor; or
9	(C) Acts as a naturopathic physician without being
10	licensed by the Arkansas State Board of Naturopathic.
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12	17-108-106. Approved naturopathic medical school.
13	(a) The Arkansas State Board of Naturopathy shall establish, by rule,
14	guidelines for an approved naturopathic medical school and specifications for
15	the education of naturopathic physicians in this state.
16	(b) The guidelines established under subsection (a) of this section
17	shall include that the approved naturopathic medical school shall require at
18	a minimum:
19	(1) Graduation from:
20	(A) A naturopathic medical education program in the United
21	States providing the degree of Doctor of Naturopathy or Doctor of
22	Naturopathic Medicine, that:
23	(i) Offers graduate-level, full-time didactic, and
24	supervised clinical training;
25	(ii) Is accredited or has achieved candidacy status
26	for accreditation by the Council on Naturopathic Medical Education or an
27	equivalent federally recognized accrediting body for naturopathic medical
28	programs also recognized by the Arkansas State Board of Naturopathy; and
29	(iii) Is an institution of higher education or part
30	of an institution of higher education that is either accredited or is a
31	candidate for accreditation by a regional or national institutional
32	accrediting agency recognized by the United States Secretary of Education;
33	(B) A degree-granting institution of higher education
34	that, before the existence of the Council on Naturopathic Medical Education,
35	offered a full-time, structured curriculum in basic sciences and supervised
36	patient care comprising a doctoral naturopathic medical education requiring

1 not less than one hundred thirty-two (132) weeks of coursework to be 2 completed within a period of not less than thirty-five (35) months, that was reputable and in good standing in the judgment of the Arkansas State Board of 3 4 Naturopathy and which, if still in existence, has current programmatic 5 accreditation by the Council on Naturopathic Medical Education or a federally 6 recognized equivalent accrediting agency; 7 (C) A diploma-granting, degree-equivalent institution of 8 higher education located in Canada that, before the existence of the Council on Naturopathic Medical Education, had provincial approval for participation 9 in government-funded student aid programs, offered a full-time, structured 10 curriculum in basic sciences and supervised patient care comprising a 11 12 doctoral naturopathic medical education requiring not less than one hundred 13 thirty-two (132) weeks of coursework to be completed within a period of not less than thirty (30) months, was reputable and in good standing in the 14 15 judgment of the Arkansas State Board of Naturopathy, and, if still in 16 existence, has current programmatic accreditation by the Council on 17 Naturopathic Medical Education or a federally recognized equivalent 18 accrediting agency, and currently has provincial approval for participation 19 in government-funded student aid programs; or 20 (D) A diploma-granting, degree-equivalent institution of 21 higher education located in Canada that has provincial approval for 22 participation in government-funded student aid programs, offers graduate-23 level, full-time didactic, and supervised clinical training, and is accredited or has achieved candidacy status for accreditation by the Council 24 25 on Naturopathic Medical Education or an equivalent federally recognized accrediting body for naturopathic medical programs also recognized by the 26 27 Arkansas State Board of Naturopathy; and 28 (2) Successful completion of a competency-based national 29 naturopathic medicine licensing examination administered by the North American Board of Naturopathic Examiners, or an equivalent agency recognized 30 by the Arkansas State Board of Naturopathy, or, for graduates of approved 31 naturopathic medical programs in the United States before the existence of 32 the Council on Naturopathic Medical Education, a competency-based state 33 34 naturopathic medicine licensing examination, or equivalent Canadian

approved by the Arkansas State Board of Naturopathy.

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2	Subchapter 2 - Arkansas State Board of Naturopathic
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4	17-108-201. Arkansas State Board of Naturopathy - Creation.
5	(a) There is created the Arkansas State Board of Naturopathy.
6	(b)(1)(A) The board shall consist of thirteen (13) members appointed
7	by the Governor for terms of six (6) years.
8	(B) The Governor shall consider diversity of practice
9	specialties and geographical areas of practice in making appointments to the
10	board.
11	(2)(A)(i) Ten (10) members shall be qualified, licensed, and
12	active naturopathic physicians appointed by the Governor and shall be subject
13	to confirmation by the Senate.
14	(ii) At least two (2) members shall be appointed
15	from each of the state's four (4) congressional districts.
16	(iii) Two (2) members shall be appointed at large.
17	(B) Congressional district representation required under
18	this subdivision (b)(2) shall be achieved by appointment as vacancies occur.
19	(3) One (1) member shall be a licensed practicing naturopathic
20	physician in this state and shall be appointed by the Governor and shall be
21	subject to confirmation by the Senate.
22	(4)(A) Two (2) members of the board shall not be actively
23	engaged in or be retired from the practice of naturopathic medicine.
24	(B) One (1) member shall represent consumers, and one (1)
25	member shall be sixty (60) years of age or older and shall represent the
26	<u>elderly.</u>
27	(C) Both shall be appointed from the state at large
28	subject to confirmation by the Senate.
29	(D) The two (2) positions may not be held by the same
30	person.
31	(E) Both shall be full voting members but shall not
32	participate in the grading of examinations.
33	(c)(1) The term of each member shall expire on December 31 of the year
34	designated, and a successor appointee shall be appointed by the Governor,
35	subject to confirmation by the Senate, on or before the expiration date of
36	the term expiring.

1	(2) A member may not serve on the board for more than two (2)
2	full terms or more than thirteen (13) years.
3	(d) Vacancies on the board shall be filled by appointment by the
4	Governor within thirty (30) days of the vacancy.
5	(e) The members of the board shall take the oath prescribed by the
6	Arkansas Constitution for state officers before entering upon the discharge
7	of their duties.
8	(f)(1) Members of the board may be removed from the office by the
9	Governor:
10	(A) For good cause under § 25-16-804;
11	(B) For cause including dishonorable or unprofessional
12	conduct, abuse of authority, malfeasance, misfeasance, or nonfeasance; or
13	(C) For any reason that would justify probation,
14	suspension, or revocation of a license to practice naturopathic medicine.
15	(2) A member of the board shall not be involved in the
16	investigation except to cooperate with the investigation as required by the
17	<u>investigator.</u>
18	
19	17-108-202. Organization and proceedings.
20	(a)(1) Within thirty (30) days after their appointment, the members of
21	the Arkansas State Board of Naturopathy shall meet and organize by electing a
22	chair, vice chair, and treasurer.
23	(2) The Treasurer of the Arkansas State Board of Naturopathy
24	shall give bond in such amount as may be designated by the board, which may
25	be increased or decreased from time to time, conditioned for the faithful
26	disbursement and accounting of all moneys coming into his or her hands as the
27	treasurer.
28	(b) The board shall hold its regular meetings as established by rule
29	of the board and shall have the power to call and hold special meetings at
30	such times and places as deemed necessary.
31	
32	17-108-203. Powers and duties.
33	The Arkansas State Board of Naturopathy shall:
34	(1) Regulate the licensure of naturopathic physicians and
35	determine the hours of continuing education units required for maintaining
36	<u>licensure as a naturopathic physician;</u>

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1	(2) Prescribe the manner in which records of examinations and
2	treatments shall be kept and maintained;
3	(3) Establish:
4	(A) Standards for professional responsibility and conduct;
5	(B) Criteria for advertising or promotional materials;
6	(C) Continuing education hours and content;
7	(D) Standards for the state jurisprudence examination;
8	(E) Schedules for providing licensing examinations and for
9	the issuance of examination results;
10	(F) Procedures and standards for reviewing licensing
11	examination scores;
12	(G) Procedures for reviewing transcripts demonstrating
13	completion of an approved naturopathic medical school;
14	(H) Requirements for issuance and renewal of licenses; and
15	(I) Any other matter necessary to implement this chapter;
16	(4) Identify disciplinary actions and circumstances that require
17	disciplinary action;
18	(5) Develop a means to provide information to all naturopathic
19	physicians in the state;
20	(6) Provide for:
21	(A) The investigation of complaints against naturopathic
22	physicians or persons holding themselves out as naturopathic physicians in
23	the state;
24	(B) The publication of information for the public about
25	naturopathic physicians and the practice of naturopathic medicine in the
26	state; and
27	(C) An orderly process for reinstatement of a license; and
28	(7) Create and maintain a list of approved naturopathic medical
29	schools that meet statutory requirements under this chapter.
30	
31	<u>Subchapter 3 — Licensure</u>
32	
33	17-108-301. Qualifications for licensure.
34	The Arkansas State Board of Naturopathy shall license an applicant who:
35	(1) Submits, in accordance with rules of the Arkansas State
36	Board of Naturopathy, the following items to the Arkansas State Board of

1	Naturopathy:
2	(A) An application for licensure developed by the Arkansas
3	State Board of Naturopathy and submitted in accordance with rules of the
4	Arkansas State Board of Naturopathy;
5	(B) An application fee submitted in an amount and manner
6	established by rules of the Arkansas State Board of Naturopathy;
7	(C) Evidence that the applicant has:
8	(i) Graduated from an approved naturopathic medical
9	school;
10	(ii) Successfully completed a competency-based
11	national naturopathic medicine licensing examination; and
12	(iii) Passed a state jurisprudence examination that
13	meets standards established in rules of the Arkansas State Board of
14	Naturopathy; and
15	(D) Evidence of professional liability insurance with
16	policy limits not less than prescribed by the Arkansas State Board of
17	Naturopathy;
18	(2) Is determined by the Arkansas State Board of Naturopathy to
19	be physically and mentally capable of safely practicing naturopathic medicine
20	with or without reasonable accommodation; and
21	(3) Has not had a license to practice naturopathic medicine or
22	other healthcare license, registration, or certificate refused, revoked, or
23	suspended by any other jurisdiction for reasons that relate to the
24	applicant's ability to skillfully and safely practice naturopathic medicine
25	unless that license, registration, or certification has been restored to good
26	standing by that jurisdiction.
27	
28	17-108-302. Scope of practice.
29	A licensee may practice naturopathic medicine to provide primary care
30	in alignment with naturopathic medical education to:
31	(1) Perform physical examinations;
32	(2) Order laboratory examinations;
33	(3) Order diagnostic imaging studies;
34	(4) Interpret the results of laboratory examinations for
35	diagnostic purposes;
36	(5) Order and based on a radiologist's report take action on

1	diagnostic imaging studies in a manner consistent with naturopathic training;
2	(6) Prescribe, administer, dispense, and order food, extracts of
3	food, nutraceuticals, vitamins, amino acids, minerals, enzymes, botanicals
4	and their extracts, botanical medicines, homeopathic medicines, all dietary
5	supplements, and nonprescription drugs as defined by the Federal Food, Drug,
6	and Cosmetic Act, 21 U.S.C. § 301 et seq., as existing on January 1, 2025;
7	(7) Use routes of administration of medication that include
8	oral, nasal, auricular, ocular, rectal, vaginal, and transdermal consistent
9	with the education and training of a naturopathic physician;
10	(8) Perform naturopathic therapeutic medicine;
11	(9) Employ the use of naturopathic therapy; and
12	(10) Use therapeutic devices, barrier contraception, and durable
13	medical equipment.
14	
15	$\underline{17-108-303}$. License expiration and renewal — Denial and revocation —
16	Continuing education.
17	(a) A license issued or renewed under this chapter shall expire two
18	(2) years following its issuance or renewal.
19	(b) The Arkansas State Board of Naturopathy may renew the license of
20	any naturopathic physician who, upon the expiration of his or her license:
21	(1) Has submitted an application for renewal;
22	(2) Has paid the renewal fee established by rules of the board;
23	(3) Meets the qualifications for licensure under this subchapter
24	and rules of the board; and
25	(4) Meets the continuing education requirements established by
26	the board.
27	(c) The board shall grant an opportunity for a hearing to applicants
28	and licensees for whom the board intends to refuse to issue or renew a
29	license, or whose license the board proposes to revoke or suspend.
30	
31	17-108-304. Display of license.
32	A naturopathic physician shall display his or her license in his or her
33	place of business in a location clearly visible to his or her patients and
34	shall also display evidence of the naturopathic physician having completed ar
35	approved naturopathic medical school.

1	17-108-305. Referral requirement.
2	A naturopathic physician shall refer to a physician licensed to
3	practice in the state any patient whose medical condition is determined, at
4	the time of evaluation or treatment, to be beyond the scope of practice of
5	the naturopathic physician.
6	
7	SECTION 2. DO NOT CODIFY. TEMPORARY LANGUAGE. <u>Issuance of first</u>
8	licenses.
9	On or before December 1, 2025, the Arkansas State Board of Naturopathy
10	shall issue licenses to those applicants who have met the requirements of
11	this act and board rules promulgated in accordance with this act.
