16	TO CREATE THE NATUROPATHIC PHYSICIAN
17	PRACTICE ACT; TO PROVIDE FOR LICENSURE
18	OF NATUROPATHIC PHYSICIANS IN ARKANSAS;
19	AND TO CREATE THE ARKANSAS STATE BOARD
20	OF NATURAL MEDICINE.

22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
23	
24	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 17 is amended to add an additional
25	chapter to read as follows:
26	<u>CHAPTER 108</u>
27	NATUROPATHIC PHYSICIAN PRACTICE ACT
28	
29	<u>Subchapter 1 — General Provisions</u>
30	
31	<u>17-108-101. Title.</u>
32	This subchapter shall be known and may be cited as the "Naturopathic
33	Physician Practice Act".
34	
35	17-108-102. Legislative findings and intent.
36	(a) The General Assembly finds that:



1	(1) The practice of naturopathic medicine in this state affects
2	the public health, safety, and welfare and should be subject to regulation
3	and control in the public interest; and
4	(2) Naturopathic physicians comprise a distinct healthcare
5	profession that affects the public health, safety, and welfare and increases
6	freedom of choice in health care in this state.
7	(b) It is the intent of the General Assembly to ensure that
8	naturopathic physicians and the practice of naturopathic medicine as defined
9	in this subchapter merit the confidence of the public, that only qualified
10	persons be authorized to practice naturopathic medicine in this state, and
11	that a person shall not practice naturopathic medicine without a valid
12	existing license.
13	
14	<u>17-108-103. Definitions.</u>
15	As used in this subchapter:
16	(1) "Approved naturopathic medical school" means a medical
17	school approved by the Arkansas State Board of Natural Medicine under this
18	subchapter that prepares a naturopathic physician for the practice of
19	naturopathic medicine;
20	(2) "Clinical laboratory procedure" means the use of
21	venipuncture consistent with naturopathic medical practice, commonly used
22	diagnostic modalities consistent with naturopathic practice, the recording of
23	a patient's health history, physical examination, ordering and interpretation
24	of radiographic diagnostics, and other standard imaging and examination of
25	body orifices, excluding endoscopy and colonoscopy;
26	(3) "Electromagnetism" means the administration of electricity
27	or its derivatives to assist in tissue healing and regeneration by cell
28	stimulation, removal of edema and inflammatory mediators, and angiogenesis;
29	(4) "Homeopathic medicine" means a system of medicine based on
30	the use of infinitesimal doses of substances capable of producing symptoms
31	similar to those of the disease treated, as listed in the Homeopathic
32	Pharmacopoeia of the United States;
33	(5) "Hygiene" means the use of preventive techniques, including
34	personal hygiene, asepsis, public health, and safety;
35	(6) "Laboratory examination" means:
36	(A) Phlebotomy;

1	(B) A clinical laboratory procedure;
2	(C) An orificial examination;
3	(D) A physiological function test; and
4	(E) A screening or test that is consistent with
5	naturopathic education and training;
6	(7) "Naturopathic medicine" means:
7	(A) A system of health care for the prevention, diagnosis,
8	and treatment of human health conditions, injury, and disease;
9	(B) The promotion or restoration of health; and
10	(C) The support and stimulation of a patient's inherent
11	self-healing processes through patient education and the use of naturopathic
12	therapies and therapeutic substances;
13	(8)(A) "Naturopathic physical medicine" means the manual
14	administration of mechanical treatment to body structures or tissues for the
15	purpose of restoring normal physiological function to the body by normalizing
16	and balancing the musculoskeletal system of the body, including massage,
17	stretching, resistance, or joint play examination.
18	(B) "Naturopathic physical medicine" does not include:
19	(i) The employment or application of chiropractic or
20	spinal adjustments and the principles or techniques of chiropractic science;
21	<u>or</u>
22	(ii) The manipulation or adjustment of the spine or
23	extremity joints of the human body beyond the elastic barrier, including
24	small amplitude movement at or beyond the end range of normal joint motion;
25	(9) "Naturopathic physician" means an individual licensed under
26	this subchapter as a naturopathic physician to practice naturopathic medicine
27	<u>in this state;</u>
28	(10) "Naturopathic therapeutic medicine" means the use of one
29	(1) or more of the following physical agents in a manner consistent with
30	naturopathic medical practice on a part or the whole of the body, by hand or
31	by mechanical means, in the resolution of a human ailment or condition:
32	<u>(A) Air;</u>
33	<u>(B) Water;</u>
34	<u>(C) Heat;</u>
35	<u>(D) Cold;</u>
36	<u>(E) Sound;</u>

1		(F) Light;
2		(G) Electromagnetism;
3		(H) Soft tissue therapy;
4		(I) Therapeutic exercise; or
5		(J) Naturopathic physical medicine;
6	(11)	"Naturopathic therapy" means the use of:
7		(A) Naturopathic therapeutic medicine;
8		(B) Suggestion;
9		(C) Hygiene;
10		(D) A therapeutic substance;
11		(E) Nutrition and food science;
12		(F) Homeopathic medicine; or
13		(G) A clinical laboratory procedure;
14	(12)	"Nutrition and food science" means the prevention and
15	<u>treatment of disea</u>	se or other human conditions through the use of food,
16	<u>water, herbs, root</u>	s, bark, or natural food elements;
17	(13)	"Professional examination" means a competency-based
18	<u>national naturopat</u>	hic physician licensing examination administered by the
19	<u>North American Boa</u>	rd of Naturopathic Examiners or its successor agency, which
20	<u>nationally adminis</u>	ters a naturopathic examination that represents federal
21	<u>standards of educa</u>	tion and training;
22	<u>(14)</u>	"Suggestion" means a technique using:
23		(A) Biofeedback;
24		<u>(B) Hypnosis;</u>
25		(C) Health education; or
26		(D) Health counseling; and
27	<u>(15)</u>	"Therapeutic substance" means any of the following

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2	<u>17-108-104. Exemptions.</u>
3	This subchapter does not prohibit or restrict:
4	(1) The practice of a healthcare profession by an individual who
5	is licensed, certified, or registered under the laws of this state and who is
6	performing services within the individual's scope of practice;
7	(2) The practice of naturopathic medicine by a student enrolled
8	in an approved naturopathic medical school if the practice of naturopathic
9	medicine by a student is performed under a course of instruction or an
10	assignment from an instructor and under the supervision of an instructor who
11	is a licensee or a duly licensed professional in the instructed field;
12	(3) A person that sells a vitamin or herb from providing
13	information about the vitamin or herb;
14	(4) The practice of naturopathic medicine by a person who is
15	licensed to practice in any other state or district in the United States and
16	who enters this state to consult with a naturopathic physician of this state
17	if the consultation is limited to examination, recommendation, or testimony
18	<u>in litigation; or</u>
19	(5) A person or practitioner who is not licensed as a
20	naturopathic physician from recommending ayurvedic medicine, herbal remedies,
21	nutritional advice, homeopathy, or other therapy that is within the scope of
22	practice of naturopathic medicine if that person or practitioner does not:
23	(A) Use a title protected under this subchapter;
24	(B) Represent or assume the character or appearance of a
25	licensee of this subchapter; or
26	(C) Otherwise use a name, title, or other designation that
27	indicates or implies that the person is a licensee of this subchapter.

29	17-108-105. Title protection.
30	(a) A licensee shall use the title "naturopathic physician" or
31	"naturopathic doctor" and the recognized abbreviation "N.D.".
32	(b) A licensee has the exclusive right to use the following terms in
33	reference to the licensee's self:

35	(2) "Naturopathic doctor";

6	(c) An individual represents the individual's self to be a
7	naturopathic physician or a naturopathic doctor when the individual uses or

10	(d)(l) An individual shall not represent the individual's self to the
11	public as a naturopathic physician, naturopathic doctor, a doctor of
12	naturopathic medicine, or a doctor of naturopathy, or as being otherwise
13	authorized to practice naturopathic medicine in the state, unless the
14	individual is licensed under this subchapter.
15	(2) An individual who is not licensed under this subchapter is
16	guilty of a Class A misdemeanor if he or she:
17	(A) Holds himself or herself out as a naturopathic
18	physician or naturopathic doctor;
19	(B) Uses any combination or abbreviation of the term
20	"naturopathic physician" or "naturopathic doctor" indicating or implying that
21	he or she is a naturopathic physician or naturopathic doctor; or
22	(C) Acts as a naturopathic physician without being
23	licensed by the Arkansas State Board of Natural Medicine.
24	
25	17-108-106. Approved naturopathic medical school.
26	(a) The Arkansas State Board of Natural Medicine shall establish, by
27	rule, guidelines for an approved naturopathic medical school and
28	specifications for the education of naturopathic physicians in this state.
29	(b) The guidelines established under subsection (a) of this section
30	shall include that the approved naturopathic medical school shall require at
31	<u>a minimum:</u>
32	(1) Graduation from:
33	(A) A naturopathic medical education program in the United
34	States providing the degree of Doctor of Naturopathy or Doctor of
35	Naturopathic Medicine, that:
36	(i) Offers graduate-level, full-time didactic, and

1	supervised clinical training;
2	(ii) Is accredited or has achieved candidacy status

15	completed within a period of not less than thirty-five (35) months, that was
16	reputable and in good standing in the judgment of the Arkansas State Board of
17	Natural Medicine and which, if still in existence, has current programmatic
18	accreditation by the Council on Naturopathic Medical Education or a federally
19	recognized equivalent accrediting agency;
20	(C) A diploma-granting, degree-equivalent institution of
21	higher education located in Canada that, before the existence of the Council
22	on Naturopathic Medical Education, had provincial approval for participation
23	in government-funded student aid programs, offered a full-time, structured
24	curriculum in basic sciences and supervised patient care comprising a
25	doctoral naturopathic medical education requiring not less than one hundred
26	thirty-two (132) weeks of coursework to be completed within a period of not
27	less than thirty (30) months, was reputable and in good standing in the
28	judgment of the Arkansas State Board of Natural Medicine, and, if still in
29	existence, has current programmatic accreditation by the Council on
30	Naturopathic Medical Education or a federally recognized equivalent
31	accrediting agency, and currently has provincial approval for participation
32	in government-funded student aid programs; or
33	(D) A diploma-granting, degree-equivalent institution of
34	higher education located in Canada that has provincial approval for
35	participation in government-funded student aid programs, offers graduate-
36	level, full-time didactic, and supervised clinical training, and is

1	accredited or has achieved candidacy status for accreditation by the Council
2	on Naturopathic Medical Education or an equivalent federally recognized
3	accrediting body for naturopathic medical programs also recognized by the
4	Arkansas State Board of Natural Medicine; and
5	(2) Successful completion of a competency-based national
6	naturopathic medicine licensing examination administered by the North
7	American Board of Naturopathic Examiners, or an equivalent agency recognized
8	by the Arkansas State Board of Natural Medicine, or, for graduates of
9	approved naturopathic medical programs in the United States before the
10	existence of the Council on Naturopathic Medical Education, a competency-
11	based state naturopathic medicine licensing examination, or equivalent
12	Canadian provincial licensing examination for the practice of naturopathic
13	medicine approved by the Arkansas State Board of Natural Medicine.

17	(4) Interpret the results of laboratory examinations for
18	<u>diagnostic purposes;</u>
19	(5) Order and, based on a radiologist's report, take action on
20	diagnostic imaging studies in a manner consistent with naturopathic training;
21	(6) Prescribe, administer, dispense, and order food, extracts of
22	food, nutraceuticals, vitamins, amino acids, minerals, enzymes, botanicals
