22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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24	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 26-26-1120 is amended to read as follows:
25	26-26-1120. Disabled persons — Definition.
26	<del>(a)</del> As used in Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 79, "disabled person"
27	means a person who:
28	(1) Is disabled for purposes of Title XIX of the Social Security
29	Act, 42 U.S.C. § 1396 et seq., as in effect on January 1, 2003, for any
30	period during the calendar year;
31	(2) Is a permanently and totally disabled veteran as defined by
32	38 C.F.R. § 4.1 et seq., Part IV, as in effect on January 1, 2003; or
33	(3) Has received permanent and total disability insurance
34	benefits for any period of time during the calendar year.
35	(b)(l) When a disabled person or a person sixty-five (65) years of age
36	or older sells his or her real property, the purchaser shall not be entitled



1	to claim any reduction to the real property's assessed value.
2	(2) On or after January 1 of the year following the date of the
3	sale, the county assessor shall assess the real property at its full market
4	value, unadjusted for assessment limitations required by Arkansas
5	Constitution, Amendment 79.
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7	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 26-26-1123 is amended to read as follows:
8	26-26-1123. Sale of real property.
9	(a) When a person <del>sells his or her</del> <u>purchases</u> real property, the county
10	assessor shall assess the real property at twenty percent (20%) of the
11	appraised value <del>at the next assessment date after</del> <u>on</u> the date of the transfer
12	of title to the real property.
13	(b) The owner of real property to whom title is transferred by a sale
14	is <del>not</del> <u>then immediately</u> entitled to claim any limitation on <u>future increases</u>
15	to the assessed value of the real property <del>until the second assessment date</del>
16	after the date of the transfer of title to the real property as described in
17	Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 79.
18	(c) This section does not The protections under this section and under
19	Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 79 apply to any transfer of title to real
20	property claimed as a homestead in which the owner or beneficiary of the
21	homestead retains a life-estate interest in the homestead following the
22	transfer of title to the real property.
23	(d) This section does not apply to the purchase of a homestead by a
24	person who is disabled or is sixty-five (65) years of age or older whose
25	assessed or taxable value of his or her homestead cannot be increased for any
26	reason after the date of purchase unless substantial improvements are made to
27	the homestead as provided in Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 79.
