This is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the 3 4 appropriation act(s) for a state agency and the general revenue allocations 5 authorized for each fund and fund account by amendment to the Revenue 6 Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly has determined that the 7 Department of Human Services may operate more efficiently if some flexibility 8 is provided to the Department of Human Services authorizing broad powers 9 under this Section. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate that the 10 General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of the 11 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this section. 12 The requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of 13 14 approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled 15 unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is 16 void.

17The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, $\frac{2024}{2025}$ 18 $\frac{2025}{2025}$ through June 30, $\frac{2025}{2026}$.

20 SECTION *16*. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 21 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SPECIAL 22 RATES OF PAY AND EMPLOYMENT WORK DAYS. For employees hired on or after July 23 1, 2013, at the Arkansas State Hospital in the classifications listed below, 24 the Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services Director shall 25 implement salary adjustments utilizing the approved pay grid for teachers 26 employed by the Arkansas Schools for the Blind and Deaf.

27 To achieve the salary adjustments, the Division of Aging, Adult, and
28 Behavioral Health Services is authorized to pay special rates of pay for
29 classifications at the Arkansas State Hospital listed below:

The Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services shall in addition to the funds provided in this Act for Annual Career Service Recognition Payments from the Performance Fund, make available any funding generated from agency salary savings for such purposes from the funds or fund accounts as provided by law.

6 For employees hired on or after July 1, 2013, at the Arkansas State 7 Hospital in the classifications listed above either a Certified Masters 8 Teacher or a Certified Bachelors Teacher, the Division of Aging, Adult, and 9 Behavioral Health Services Director shall set the number of work days for the 10 employment year to equal the number of days worked by those employed in the 11 same classifications at the Arkansas Schools for the Blind and Deaf. The 12 accrual, use, and carryover of sick days, personal days, and holidays of the 13 employees at the Arkansas State Hospital that are hired on or after July 1, 14 2013, or current employees choosing to adopt this plan, shall be treated in 15 the same manner as those employed in the same classifications at the Arkansas 16 Schools for the Blind and Deaf.

17 Those currently employed at the Arkansas State Hospital in the 18 classifications listed above as of June 30, 2013, have the one-time option of 19 adopting this language or continuing to operate under the same salary, leave 20 and benefit plans they are currently receiving. Employees must make their 21 decision by June 30, 2013.

Accrued annual and holiday leave, up to 240 hours, as of June 30,
23 2013, will be paid out to current employees choosing to adopt this plan. Any
24 additional accrued annual and holiday leave will be forfeited. Accrued sick
25 leave, as of June 30, 2013, shall be retained on file and shall be exhausted
26 before any newly accrued sick leave may be taken.

All employees affected by this section shall be eligible to receivehazardous duty pay for time worked in eligible areas.

29 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2024
30 <u>2025</u> through June 30, 2025 <u>2026</u>.

SECTION 17. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CARRY
 FORWARD - COMMUNITY BASED CRISIS INTERVENTION CRISIS SERVICES. Any unexpended
 balance of funds allocated for Community Based Crisis Intervention Crisis
 Services in the Department of Human Services - Division of Aging, Adult, and

Behavioral Health Services from the Behavioral Health Services Fund Account which remains at the close of each state fiscal year shall be carried forward to the next state fiscal year to be used for the same intent and purposes as set forth in law. Any carry forward of unexpended balance of funding as authorized herein may be carried forward under the following conditions:

6 (1) Prior to June 30, 2024 2025, the Agency shall, by written
7 statement, set forth its reason(s) for the need to carry forward said funding
8 to the Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget;

9 (2) The Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget shall 10 report to the Arkansas Legislative Council all amounts carried forward by the 11 September Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee meeting 12 which report shall include the name of the Agency, Board, Commission, or 13 Institution and the amount of the funding carried forward, the program name 14 or line item, the funding source of that appropriation and a copy of the 15 written request set forth in (1) above;

(3) Each Agency, Board, Commission, or Institution shall provide a 16 17 written report to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee 18 containing all information set forth in item (2) above, along with a written 19 statement as to the current status of the project, contract, purpose, etc. 20 for which the carry forward was originally requested no later than thirty 21 (30) days prior to the time the Agency, Board, Commission, or Institution 22 presents its budget request to the Arkansas Legislative Council/Joint Budget 23 Committee; and

(4) Thereupon, the Department of Finance and Administration shall
include all information obtained in item (3) above in the budget manuals
and/or a statement of non-compliance by the Agency, Board, Commission, or

31 SECTION *18*. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 32 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. AGING AND 33 ADULT SERVICES - MATCHING FUNDS. The funds appropriated for state match for 34 the Arkansas Senior Olympics Program in this Act shall be paid on a two-to-35 one state/local matching basis. The Senior Arkansas Sports Organization must 36 certify its portion of the match to the Division of Aging, Adult, and

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Behavioral Health Services before any funds appropriated for state match for
 the Arkansas Senior Olympics Program in this Act are disbursed.

3 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2024
4 <u>2025</u> through June 30, 2025 <u>2026</u>.

6 SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. AGING AND 7 8 ADULT SERVICES - NURSING HOME CARE ALTERNATIVES. Funding for "Nursing Home 9 Care Alternatives", as it appears in the Aging and Adult Services -10 Operations appropriation may be used for home delivered meals, adult day 11 care, homemaker/chore, respite care, personal care, health promotion, and 12 other community-based activities. These funds may also be used to match 13 Medicaid community-based programs.

14 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2024 15 <u>2025</u> through June 30, 2025 <u>2026</u>.

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17 SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 18 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SENIOR 19 CITIZEN CENTERS. The appropriation in this act for Senior Citizen Centers 20 shall be distributed in the same manner as the funding formula requirements 21 set out in the federal Older Americans Act funding law. The additional 22 funding provided by this provision shall supplement and not supplant any 23 monies currently funding services for Senior Citizen Centers.

24 The requirements in this section shall only be implemented in accordance 25 with any necessary approval by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services 26 and in the event that additional general revenue funding is provided by the 27 General Assembly for these purposes. Should additional funding provided for 28 these purposes be insufficient to provide for the increases in full, the 29 increases shall be provided to the extent that funding is made available. The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2024 30 31 2025 through June 30, 2025 2026.

33 SECTION 21. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 34 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CARRY
 35 FORWARD OF UNOBLIGATED GENERAL REVENUE FUNDS FOR SENIOR CITIZEN CENTERS. (a)
 36 On June 30, 2019, or as soon as is practicable to determine funds available

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1 as authorized in this Section, and each fiscal year thereafter the Chief 2 Fiscal Officer of the State shall cause to be transferred on his or her books and those of the State Treasurer and Auditor of State the balance of 3 4 unobligated general revenue funds, excluding funds carried forward for other purposes, remaining in the Fund or Fund Accounts and the corresponding paying 5 6 accounts as determined by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, as set out 7 in subsection (b) herein, to the Department of Human Services - Division of 8 Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services paying account to be used 9 exclusively for the disbursement of funds for Senior Citizen Centers in the 10 amount of recouped and recovered general revenue not to exceed five hundred 11 thousand dollars (\$500,000).

12 (b) Any unobligated general revenue, excluding funds carried forward for 13 other purposes, remaining in the following Fund or Fund Accounts and the 14 corresponding paying accounts at the end of the Fiscal Year that would 15 normally be transferred into the General Revenue Allotment Reserve Fund as 16 recouped or recovered General Revenue shall be transferred as authorized in 17 subsection (a) herein:

(1) Department of Human Services Administration Fund Account;

19 (2) Children and Family Services Fund Account;

20 (3) Youth Services Fund Account:

21 (4) Developmental Disabilities Services Fund Account;

22 (5) Medical Services Fund Account;

23 (6) Behavioral Health Services Fund Account;

24 (7) County Operations Fund Account; and

25 (8) Provider Services and Quality Assurance Fund Account.

26 (c)(1) Any general revenue recouped or recovered as authorized in 27 subsections (a) and (b) herein shall be carried forward to the following 28 fiscal year for Senior Citizen Centers and shall be distributed in the same 29 manner as the funding formula requirements set out in the federal Older 30 Americans Act funding law.

31 (2) The additional funding provided by this provision shall supplement 32 and not supplant any monies currently funding services for Senior Citizen 33 Centers.

34 (d) Should additional funding provided for in subsections (a) and (b) 35 herein be insufficient to provide for the full five hundred thousand dollars 36 (\$500,000) authorized, the increases shall be provided to the extent that

1 general revenue is recouped and carried forward.

(e)(1) The Department of Human Services shall provide a written report to
the Department of Finance and Administration Budget Office, the Arkansas
Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee the total amount of general
revenue carried forward and distributed as set forth in this section no later
than thirty (30) days prior to the time the Department presents its budget
request to the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee.

8 (2) The Department of Finance and Administration shall include all 9 information obtained in subsection (e)(1) herein in the budget manual 10 submitted to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee for 11 the Department.

SECTION 22. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds 13 14 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency 15 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and 16 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 17 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 18 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 19 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 20 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 21 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

22

23 SECTION 23. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General 24 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 25 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for 26 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive 27 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget 28 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or 29 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative 30 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 31

32 <u>SECTION 24. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the</u> 33 <u>General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits</u> 34 <u>the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the</u> 35 <u>effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2025 is essential to the operation of</u> 36 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in

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1	the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
2	effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2025 could work irreparable harm
3	upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
4	programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
5	being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
6	and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2025.
