24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:									
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26	SECTION 1. TITLE. This act shall be known and may be cited as the									
27	"Protect Our Constitution Act".

29	SECTION 2. Pursuant to the authority granted by Arkansas Constitution	ι,								
30	Article 5, § 1, the subsection of Arkansas Constitution, Article 5, § 1,									
31	titled "Majority" is amended to read as follows:									
32	Majority. $(a)(1)$ Any Except as provided in subdivision $(a)(2)$ of thi	<u>.s</u>								
33	section, any measure submitted to the people as herein provided shall take									
34	effect and become a law when approved by a majority of the votes cast upon									
35	such measure, and not otherwise, and shall not be required to receive a									
36	majority of the electors voting at such election.									

1	(2) A constitutional amendment submitted to the people as herein
2	provided shall take effect and become a law when approved by at least two-
3	thirds (2/3) of the votes cast upon such measure.
4	(b) Such measures After a measure has been approved by a vote of the
5	people, it shall be operative on and after the thirtieth day after the
6	election at which it is approved, unless otherwise specified in the $\frac{Act}{C}$
7	measure.
8	(c) This section shall not be construed to deprive any member of the
9	General Assembly of the right to introduce any measure, but no measure shall
10	be submitted to the people by the General Assembly, except a proposed
11	constitutional amendment or amendments as provided for in this Constitution.

13	SECTION 3. Pursuant to the authority granted by Arkansas Constitution,
14	Article 5, § 1, the subsection of Arkansas Constitution, Article 5, § 1,
15	titled "Conflicting Measures", is amended to read as follows:
16	Conflicting Measures. If conflicting measures initiated or referred to
17	the people shall be approved by a majority of the votes severally east for
18	and against the same as herein provided at the same election, the one
19	receiving the highest number of affirmative votes shall become law.
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21	SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
22	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that amendments to the Arkansas
23	Constitution impact the public peace, health, and safety of each citizen of
24	this state; that to protect the public peace, health, and safety of the
25	citizens of this state, it is necessary to increase the threshold for passage
26	of a constitutional amendment proposed under Arkansas Constitution, Article
27	5, § 1, to ensure that constitutional amendments are supported by an
28	appropriate number of voters to justify an amendment to the Arkansas
29	Constitution; and that this act should become effective at the earliest
30	opportunity to ensure that its provisions are in place for the 2026 general
31	election. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being
32	immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and
33	safety shall become effective on:
34	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
35	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
36	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
