- WHEREAS, an extraordinary occasion has arisen making it necessary to convene the 84th General Assembly into extraordinary session; and
- WHEREAS, the Regular Session of the 84th General Assembly adjourned sine die on April 16, 2003, without providing appropriation authority, funding and revenue necessary to provide essential and critical services to the citizens of Arkansas; and
- WHEREAS, there is an immediate and pressing need for appropriations to ensure the continued funding of certain agencies, state constitutional offices, departments, boards, commissions, institutions of higher education, and other programs; and
- WHEREAS, there is an immediate and pressing need to provide additional state revenue and funding necessary to pay for essential and critical state services;
