Fiscal Summary

Act 1 of the First Extraordinary Session, 2008 (HB 1001) - This act provides supplemental appropriation for expenses payable from the Constitutional Officers Fund for the House of Representatives.

General Summaries

Act 2 of the First Extraordinary Session, 2008 (HB1003) - This act extends to December 31, 2008, the deadline by which a Pulaski County school district involved in the desegregation litigation case styled *Little Rock School District v. Pulaski County Special School District No. 1, No. LR-4:82CV00866-WRW-JTR, In the United States District Court, Eastern District of Arkansas, Western Division, must obtain unitary status or partial unitary status in order to request a reimbursement from the state for legal fees under A.C.A. § 6-20-416(c). The act also provides that the total financial obligation of the state in any one (1) year under a post-unitary agreement authorized by A.C.A. § 6-20-416(b) shall not exceed the state's desegregation obligation for the 2008-2009 school year, a year later than the date originally set in Act 395 of 2007.*

Act 3 of the First Extraordinary Session, 2008 (HB1005) - This act repeals the changes in the marriage laws made by Act 441 of 2007 and re-establishes the minimum age for marriage at seventeen(17) years for males and sixteen (16) years for females with parental consent. It also provides that a circuit court judge may direct the issuance of a marriage license if the parties are under the minimum age and the female is pregnant.

Act 4 and Act 5 of the First Extraordinary Session, 2008 (HB1004) and (SB1) respectively - These identical acts increase the severance tax on natural gas. Beginning January 1, 2009, the tax shall be 1.5% on new discovery gas for the first 24 months; 1.5% on high-cost gas for the first 36 months with a possible extension of 12 additional months; 1.25% on marginal gas; and 5% on all other natural gas. These new tax rates will be based on market value. Five percent of the tax, interest, and penalties collected will be deposited in general revenues and 95% of the funds will be classified as special revenues and distributed pursuant to the Arkansas Highway Revenue Distribution Law.
