PROCLAMATION

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME - GREETINGS:

- WHEREAS: An extraordinary occasion has arisen making it necessary to convene the 92nd General Assembly into extraordinary session; and
- WHEREAS: An outbreak of coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) has spread throughout the world, resulting in a global pandemic; and
- WHERAS: On March 11, 2020, by Executive Order 20-03, an emergency was declared in the state as a result of COVID-19, and that emergency is on-going; and
- WHEREAS: COVID-19 continues to spread throughout the United States and Arkansas bringing great hardship to bear upon the citizens of Arkansas; and
- WHEREAS: Necessary measures taken in an attempt to limit the spread of COVID-19 have brought great hardship to bear upon commerce in the state, impacting the revenue of the State of Arkansas; and
- WHEREAS: On March 21, 2020, the United States Treasury Department and Internal Revenue Service announced the federal income tax filing due date is extended from April 15, 2020 to July 15, 2020, and tax payers may also defer federal income tax payments due on April 15, 2020 to July 15, 2020, without penalties and interest, regardless of the amount owed. As a result, Arkansas extended its tax deadline for individual income tax filings and payments to be consistent with this date, further impacting revenue; and
- WHEREAS: There is an urgent need for the State of Arkansas to make budgetary adjustments to respond to the impact of this emergency;
- NOW THEREFORE, I, ASA HUTCHINSON, Governor of the State of Arkansas, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by Article 6, Section 19 of the Arkansas Constitution, do hereby call an Extraordinary Session of the General Assembly to convene in Little Rock on March 26, 2020 at 1:00 p.m., and I do hereby specify that the General Assembly is convened in such Session to consider, and, if so advised, enact laws for the following purposes:
 - 1. To create the COVID-19 Rainy Day Fund; to transfer funds to the COVID-19 Rainy Day Fund; and to Declare an Emergency;
 - 2. To confirm gubernatorial appointees as required by Ark. Code Ann. $\$ 10-2-113; and
 - 3. To provide for the payment of expenses and per diem of the House of Representatives and the Senate for this Extraordinary Session.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Arkansas to be affixed this 24th day of March, in the year of our Lord 2020.

Act 1 (SB02) and Act 2 (HB1001) of the First Extraordinary Session of 2020

- Act 1 and Act 2 of the First Extraordinary Session of 2020 are identical bills that created a new fund COVID-19 Rainy Day Fund and transferred \$173,610,632 from surplus funds to the new fund.
- This action by the Legislature was in response to the reduction in general revenue distributions due to the COVID-19 crisis and to provide a mechanism to distribute funds to State Agencies that demonstrated the need for additional funding in order to provide essential services and provide funding for unanticipated COVID-19 related needs.
- Any disbursements from this fund requires approval by the Senate Pro Tempore, Speaker, and majority and minority leaders of both chambers. Two out of three of the Representatives and two out of three of the Senators is the required for approval of a release of funds.
- Any remaining balances in the fund at the end of Fiscal Year 2020 is recouped and transferred back into the General Revenue Allotment Reserve Fund, where balances are maintained until appropriated by the General Assembly.

Reductions in Net General Revenue

- On March 23, 2020 the Official General Revenue Forecast was reduced by \$353,091,462 for Fiscal Year 2020. Net general revenue available for distribution was reduced from \$5.737 billion to \$5.384 billion.
- -\$160 million reduction due to the COVID-19 Virus effects in sales tax collections.
 - o -\$55 million in the final 3 month period of Sales Tax Collections.
 - -\$105 million in the final 3 month period of Withholding Tax Collections.
- -\$211.5 million reduction due to Executive Order EO20-09 extended the individual income tax return deadline from April 15, 2020 to July 15, 2020 due to the COVID-19 emergency, which effectively moved significant state general revenue income tax collections from FY2020 to FY2021.
 - o -\$148 million in reduction in individual tax return collections.
 - o -\$63.5 million reduction in collections from individual income tax extension collections.
- An additional \$18.4 million in other various general revenue was also revised. Reductions to State Agencies and Institutions

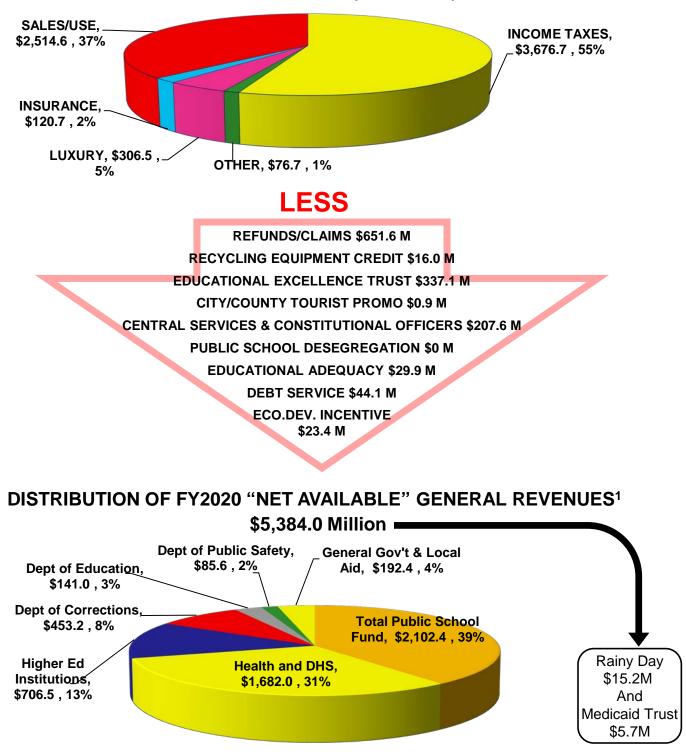
• On March 23, 2020 the Revenue Stabilization general revenue allocations were reduced to reflect the \$353.1 million reduction in the Official General Revenue Forecast which resulted in Allocation A funding at 95.8%, and Allocations B and C not being funded.

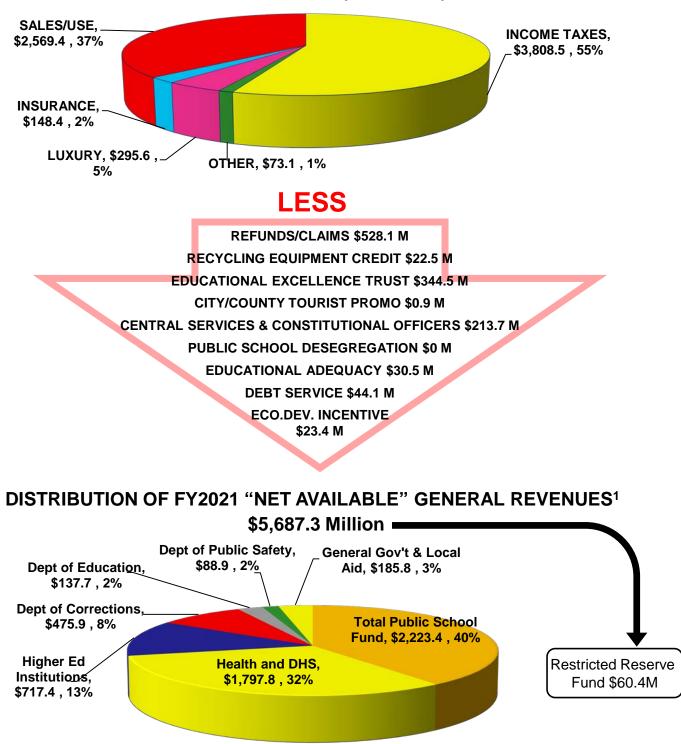

REVENUE STABILIZATION LAW FOR FY2021

Act 186 (HB1096) and Act 187 (SB83)

- The Revenue Stabilization Law allocates the amount of General Revenue to be distributed to State Agencies, State Institutions of Higher Education and Local Aid. The legislature enacts an amendment to the Revenue Stabilization Law every year to prioritized and set the maximum amount of General Revenue to be distributed.
- The schedule has five allocations which Allocation A, A1, B, C, and D. Category A is funded first then A1, then B and so on as general revenues are collected monthly up to maximum authorized or the General Revenue Forecast whichever is less.
- Allocation A provides a maximum level of funding for all the entities receiving general revenue at 85% of the previous fiscal years original balanced budget before it was reduced due to the COVID-19 crisis on April 23, 2020. The percent is based on the General Revenue Forecast from the May 15, 2019 which totaled \$5,750,205,755.
 - The exceptions are the Public School Fund, Education Facilities, Medicaid and the Division of Correction.
 - The Public School Fund's allocation in A is 95% of the previous fiscal years original balanced budget before it was reduced due to the COVID-19 crisis on April 23, 2020, with the remaining 5% in allocation A1 and an increase in allocation D for \$9.7 million to address adequacy needs.
 - The Education Facilities Partnership allocation in A is 95% of the previous fiscal years original balanced budget before it was reduced due to the COVID-19 crisis on April 23, 2020, with the remaining 5% in allocation A1.
 - Medicaid or DHS Grants allocation in A is 95% of the previous fiscal years original balanced budget before it was reduced due to the COVID-19 crisis on April 23, 2020, with the remaining 5% in allocation A1 and an increase in allocation D for \$65.4 million to address Medicaid increases.
 - The Division of Correction allocation in A is 98% of the previous fiscal years original balanced budget before it was reduced due to the COVID-19 crisis on April 23, 2020, with the remaining 5% in allocation A1 and an increase in allocation D for \$1.9 million to address inmate costs and health insurance contract increases.
- Allocation A includes \$60.4 million dollars for the Restricted Reserve Fund. This is to provide a mechanism to release funds to Agencies or State Institutions that demonstrate a need for additional general revenue funding, with legislative approval.
- Allocation A1 includes the Public School Fund at 5% of May 15 FY2020 Budget, the Education Facilities Partnership Medicaid at 5% of May 15 FY2020 Budget, Medicaid or DHS Grants at 5% of May 15 FY2020 Budget and Division of Correction at 2% of May 15 FY2020 Budget.
- Allocation B provides a maximum level of funding for all the entities receiving general revenue at 5% of the previous fiscal years original balanced budget before it was reduced due to the COVID-19 crisis on April 23, 2020.
- Allocation C provides a maximum level of funding for all the entities receiving general revenue at 5% of the previous fiscal years original balanced budget before it was reduced due to the COVID-19 crisis on April 23, 2020.

- Allocation D provides a maximum level of funding for all the entities receiving general revenue at 5% of the previous fiscal years original balanced budget before it was reduced due to the COVID-19 crisis on April 23, 2020.
- Exception in Allocation D are:
 - The Public School Fund's allocation has an increase of \$9.7 million to address adequacy needs
 - Medicaid or DHS Grants allocation has an increase of \$65.4 million to address Medicaid increases
 - The Division of Correction has an increase of \$1.9 million to address inmate costs and health insurance contract increases.
 - \$15.9 million for the Restricted Reserve Fund.
 - \$5.9 million for the Medicaid Trust Fund.
- The Rainy Day Fund does not receive any funding.

PRODUCTIVITY FUNDING FOR INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION

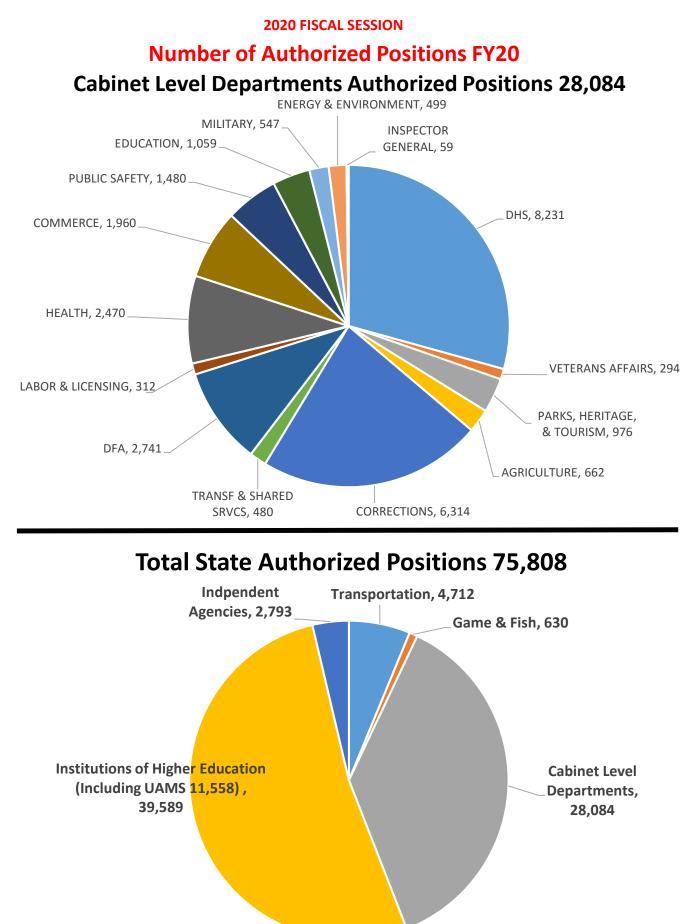
- Productivity-based funding is a mechanism to align institutional funding with statewide priorities for higher education by incentivizing progress toward statewide goals. At the same time, such models encourage accountability to students and policymakers by focusing on the success of students through the achievement of their educational goals. The new funding model is built around a set of shared principles developed by institutions and aligned with goals and objectives for post-secondary attainment in our state.
- <u>Detail of One Time Productivity Funding:</u>
- During the 2020 Fiscal Session it was determined that 18 Institutions would lose a total of \$1,670,522 Productivity Funding in general revenue in FY2020 due to the March 23, 2020 General Revenue Forecast, which totaled a reduction of -\$353 million available general revenue to distribute to all Agencies and Institutions.
- This reduction carried over into the FY2021 Base level general revenue funding which caused those same Institutions to have a total reduction of -\$1,743,683.
- Also since the FY2021 Revenue Stabilization Act was not fully funded under the April 2, 2020 General Revenue Forecast for FY2021, Institutions were projected to have another loss of -\$1,572,475 in general revenue funding.
- To address the loss Productivity Funding due to general revenue distribution reductions to Institutions the Joint Budget Committee approved a request by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State at the JBC April, 15, 2020 meeting to provide one time funding from the Restricted Reserve Fund and the Rainy Day Fund for a total of \$4,986,679.
 - \$2,542,363 Funding from the Restricted Reserve Fund for FY2020 and half of FY2021 base level reductions
 - \$2,444,316 Funding from the Rainy Day Fund for the other half of FY2021 base level funding reductions and FY2021 Productivity Funding not funded under the current forecast. If the FY2021 Forecast is revised upward to fully fund the allocations in RSA (Allocation D) then \$1,572,475 will not need to be released.
