Mr. Lieutenant Governor, President Pro Tem Hendren; Speaker Shepherd, and Members of the Arkansas General Assembly:

As I stand here today for the first time giving a State of the State address in the Senate chamber, I reflect on the extraordinary times in which we live.

We are here today for regular business, at a time in our world when everything seems irregular.

This is reflected in your Members being in the Stephens Center, miles away; and everyone here appropriately socially distanced.

These are difficult days because all that we enjoy about normal is suspended. So much of our nation is in free fall, and we don't know when the safety harness will jolt us back to a soft landing.

These are days we come together. We unite our arms together, and partner together, so all Arkansans will have confidence in our steadiness, in our determination, and in our unity.

While I was undersecretary at Homeland Security, I worked to protect our country after the 9-11 attack from the next terrorist event. But this fight is different. There is not one attack but an attack on all 50 states, and our borders will not stop this virus.

This virus is deadly. It is highly contagious, and there is no proven cure. The best doctors in the world are working on an answer or a way to control this invisible killer that invades our land.

And so, these are difficult times.

As you know, I come from the Hill country of Arkansas and yet I have fallen in love with the beauty of the Delta and the timberland of South Arkansas.

And from my travels, I have observed something about Arkansans. We know how to live through adversity. We know how to survive. We relish our independence. And we care about each other.

Those are the qualities that will take us all through the current crisis in our nation. And that brings me to the State of our State.

The honest answer is that our economic condition is uncertain, but the state of our character has never been stronger. We are prepared to beat the silent enemy that haunts our hallways. We are prepared to be a neighbor and friend to each other even though we are physically apart.

Friends, this General Assembly has accomplished much. You have lowered taxes. You have supported economic growth. You gave us a historic highway plan, increased support for education, and transformed government to work in times just like these.

And now that we have been challenged by a threat that some compare to Pearl Harbor or the 9-11 attack, this same General Assembly has responded with a sense of urgency and determination.

Thank you for your action, and thank you for your support during this time.

As we enter this session, we are looking at a nation that is under attack. We have over 374,000 cases in the United States and over 12,000 deaths.

In Arkansas, today we have crossed the 1,000 mark for COVID-19 cases. People ask me, "When will we get through this." As you know, no one really knows. But the University of Washington IHME is a very reliable source of one modeling projection. Their most-recent projections show Arkansas will peak on April 24.

It is interesting that 11 days ago, on March 27, the model predicted we would have 707 deaths in Arkansas. On April 6, the model was revised to reduce the predications on deaths down to 279.

Yesterday, we in Arkansas were at 18 deaths. Because of social distancing, protective masks, and following guidelines, we are working hard to reduce those projections even further. That is what we are doing together, and I applaud this General Assembly for you doing your part.

From an Arkansas standpoint, we have marshaled our resources to prepare for this fight. Thanks to your support, we have funded a supply of personal protective equipment for our front-line health care workers.

Thanks to you, we have funded a purchase of ventilators to be sure we have enough in the event there is a shortage in the future.

And we are prepared to do more. Let me assure every Arkansan that we will do all that is necessary to protect life and to come out of this pandemic with our face looking into the bright days of our future.

Now let me pause for a moment, and let me thank and acknowledge those who are on the front lines of this fight: I am proud, so very proud, of our emergency responders, our doctors, our nurses, our respiratory therapists, and our nursing home professionals. Please join me in giving them thanks.

Let me also express thanks to those in this General Assembly that have engaged in health care as part of their normal activities of life, and yet you have this responsibility as well.

Since I declared a public health emergency on March 11, four weeks ago, we have taken aggressive and unprecedented measures to stop the spread of this contagion.

We closed:

- Schools.
- Restaurants.
- Bars and the state's three casinos.
- Barbershops, hair salons, massage-therapy clinics, and tattoo parlors – all closed.
- Fitness centers, movie theaters, bowling alleys, and indoor amusement centers – all closed.
- State park lodges closed; and we prohibited overnight camping in our state parks.
- We have limited gatherings to 10 or fewer people.
- We are practicing social distancing. And we've added to that the recommendation to wear a mask when social distancing is impractical or doesn't work.
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- We expanded telemedicine.
- I directed state employees to work remotely when possible.
- We suggested that companies allow their employees to work remotely as well.

But all of this has been done with a realization that these emergency actions have caused people to lose their jobs and their livelihood. It has caused some businesses to close and others to scale back. And in each one of these cases it is heartbreaking to me and to our state to see our fellow citizens pay the consequences in that fashion.

I expect that our unemployment claims will continue to rise, all the result of this historic pandemic. There has been nothing like it in our lifetime. We have processed over 110,000 claims to date.

For those who have suffered business losses, our message is that we are working to get financial assistance to you. In our bridge loan program, we have provided almost \$3 million in assistance to 130 applicants. These are bridge loans until federal resources come to bear and help these businesses.

But let's talk about the future just for a moment. We have learned some things from this national public health emergency.

First of all, we've learned that nothing beats face-to-face instruction in education. But teachers can teach remotely and students can learn remotely, and they are dedicated to that task. It all emphasizes the importance of high-speed broadband internet in our state for education and business. We need to continue to invest, and invest more to meet this need of the future.

In terms of healthcare, telemedicine not only works, but is a necessary part of access and affordability. We have seen that, and we need to expand it.

When it comes to higher education, the college campus atmosphere is so important to the quality of life of the student. But we need to reexamine the needs on our campuses, when we see the variety of the ways our students learn.

In the area of sports, I miss sports. I miss the spirit of competition. Young people build character, discipline and hard work from sports. I hope we get back to sports soon. But how will it change? Only time will tell.

In terms of government, the delivery of services to our citizens on line has proven to be not just a convenient option for some, but it has proven to be the only option in some circumstances. Let's build that capacity even more. From SNAP benefits to unemployment insurance to driver's licenses and other revenue office functions, let's do all online that we can for efficiency and for savings and for the convenience of our citizens.

And then there is the economy. Our foundations are strong. Our foundations are not shaken. The infrastructure above it, may be a little bit. But our foundations are strong. There are new industries in the pipeline waiting to come here; there are other businesses waiting to build and to expand and to start hiring. We are not slowing down; we are just pausing, out of necessity.

We will recover quickly and energetically, because we believe in work, entrepreneurship, and global leadership.

And that brings me to the importance of this session. I have submitted my balanced budget. But I need your help to trim it as a result of the revised forecast, which cut our anticipated state revenue by \$205 million for next year.

My administration will take the necessary steps to reduce travel; freeze state employment numbers; and take other cost-saving measures.

We will maintain our commitment to funding public education, public safety, and Medicaid. But to do so, we will need to have some reserve funds with flexibility and oversight to be sure there is no gap in essential services to our citizens.

On the positive side, we have maintained our safety net for our citizens through public benefits that are important through this difficult time. We have continued to invest in economic growth opportunities. And we have not touched our Long-Term Reserve Fund of \$152 million. We need those reserve funds for whatever the future brings.

I also want to thank you for passing legislation that transformed state government. It is now leaner and more agile. As a result, we can respond more quickly to unexpected events. And it seems like we have had our share of those lately.

We have learned through this public health emergency about how fragile life can be. But we've also seen courage and compassion of Arkansans in action. Our nurses, doctors, respiratory therapists, and EMTs are on the front lines, risking their lives every day.

I also want to thank the extraordinary and sacrificial work of Dr.

Nate Smith and his team at the Department of Health, and Director A.J.

Gary and his team at Emergency Management. Please join me in thanking them.

We see neighbors checking on neighbors, making grocery runs for those who can't leave their house. Truckers are driving long hours to ensure the supply chain isn't broken. Others are providing meals on the road so cross-country drivers can have an option to eat. Cafeteria workers are making sandwiches for the kids who count on school meals, and bus drivers are taking the meals to them.

Members of this assembly, we may make mistakes, but make no mistake – our eyes are fixed on our next opportunity, our next challenge, and our next future victories that are before us.

We will do what Americans and Arkansans have always done. We will be strong, and we will prevail.

Thank you. And especially thank you for your efforts during these difficult times.

I wanted to write and make clear some additional information about any possible conflicts in an effort to comply with Rule 24.06 of the Senate Ethics Rules. I am a lawyer actively engaged in the practice of law with the law firm McMath Woods, P.A. I am a partner at that law firm. McMath Woods P.A. is generally a plaintiff's law firm that represents individuals in injury, employment, and environmental matters. There are currently 6 active partners in the firm. Any legislation affecting the judicial branch of government or the courts could "relate to" the business that employs me. I do not intend, nor do I feel it would be appropriate, to recuse from voting on matters related to the judicial branch of government or matters that relate generally to the practice of law. We are making laws, or repealing them (we should probably do that more often) and therefor everything in essence relates, or could relate, to the practice of law.

I have previously disclosed that other partners at McMath Woods P.A. represent clients that have three claims pending before the Arkansas Claims Commission. These claims pre-dated my election to the Senate. I am not involved personally in the representation of any of the clients of McMath Woods P.A. involved in these cases. I have previously provided the case names and a disclosure. That correspondence is attached again.

Also, one of my law partners, as disclosed for 2018, continues to represent the Ozark Society.

I sit on the Central Arkansas Boys and Girls Club Board of Directors. I do not anticipate any conflicts arising with regards to that service, but I note it just for general disclosure purposes. My wife, Gabriel Bond, works part-time for United Realty in Little Rock.

- (3) Fifteen million eight hundred seventy-seven thousand four hundred seventy six dollars (\$15,877,476), or so much thereof as is available shall be included and added to the amount distributed in (e)(1) of this section and shall be distributed by the Treasurer of State in monthly amounts with each allocation's proportion of the total of (e)(1), (e)(2)(A) and (e)(3) to supplement the Restricted Reserve Fund.

Amend Senate Bill No. 42 as originally introduced:

Page 19, insert the additional SECTIONS immediately following SECTION 23 to read as follows:

" SECTION 24. APPROPRIATION - CASH FUNDS - PANS/PANDAS. There is hereby appropriated, to the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, to be payable from cash funds as defined by Arkansas Code 19-4-801, for personal services and operating expenses of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences - PANS/PANDAS Clinic and Programs for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2021, the following:

SECTION 25. APPROPRIATION - RURAL BROADBAND GRANTS. There is hereby appropriated, to the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, to be payable from the Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund, for rural broadband grants by the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences Institute for Digital Health and Innovation for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2021, the following:

SECTION 26. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS AND INTENT.

- (a) The General Assembly finds that:
- (1) Generally, local entities do not budget for or have funds available for broadband due-diligence business studies in connection with making application for federal grants or loans for broadband development programs;
- (2) In order to spur further development of broadband in rural Arkansas, it is necessary for local entities to conduct due-diligence business studies before application for federal grants or loans for broadband development programs;
- (3) Expenses associated with broadband due-diligence business studies can be burdensome to rural Arkansas communities, and it is in the best interest of all Arkansans to make this investment;
- (4) Under current Arkansas law, only certain eligible telecommunications carriers have benefitted from the Arkansas High Cost Fund, which underwrites broadband deployment; and
 - (5) It is necessary to provide funds to local entities to further wide-

spread broadband deployment, particularly in unserved and underserved rural

Arkansas, and to determine the feasibility of broadband deployment for local entities
that currently do not have federally-defined broadband services and where these
broadband due-diligence business studies have not been conducted before.

(b) It is the intent of the General Assembly to provide funds to local entities to defray expenses for broadband due-diligence business studies in connection with preparation for federal grant and loan applications for broadband development programs administered by the Federal Communications Commission, the United States Department of Agriculture, or other federal agency to spur federally-defined broadband development in rural Arkansas.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021.

SECTION 27. SPECIAL LANGUAGE — CODE AMENDMENT. Arkansas Code Title 19, Chapter 5, Subchapter 11, is amended to add an additional section to read as follows:

- <u>19-5-1154.</u> Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund Creation Purpose Definitions.
- (a) There is created on the books of the Treasurer of State, the Auditor of State, and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, a trust fund to be known as the "Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund".
- (b) The Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund shall be used for onetime grants for the defrayment of expenses for broadband due-diligence business studies incurred by prospective federal broadband program applicants, in anticipation of and before application for funding from:
- (1) The Federal Communications Commission's Rural Digital Opportunity Fund program;
- (2) The United States Department of Agriculture's Rural eConnectivity Pilot Program, otherwise known as the "ReConnect Program";
 - (3) The United States Department of Agriculture's "Farm Bill"; or
- (4) Other federal grants or loans for broadband development programs.
- (c) The Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund shall consist of funds authorized or provided by law.
- (d) Broadband due-diligence business studies shall be conducted and concluded within one hundred eighty (180) days of the receipt of the Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund Grant.
- (e) Upon receipt of a Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund Grant, the local entity shall file a surety bond for the benefit of the State of Arkansas with the Treasurer of State in the amount of the Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund grant for assurance that the Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund grant is utilized for broadband due-diligence business studies.
 - (f) As used in this act:
 - (1)(A) "Broadband due-diligence business studies" means analytical

research designed to acquire the data necessary to support applications for federal grants or loans for broadband development programs.

(B) "Broadband due-diligence business studies" includes

without limitation:

(i) Full feasibility determinations, including economic

business plans;

(ii) Twenty-year financial break-even analysis;

(iii) Competitive broadband analysis;

(iv) Demographic analysis, with comparison to other

projects;

(v) The ordering of construction plans to maximize

return; and

(vi) Analysis of federal funding opportunities; and

(2) "local entity" means a county, including without limitation an unincorporated community within a county, a city of the first class, a city of the second class, and an incorporated town.

SECTION 28. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. MANAGEMENT OF RURAL BROADBAND I.D. EXPENSES TRUST FUND GRANT APPLICATION PROCESS.

- (a) The Institute for Digital Health and Innovation of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences shall manage the Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund grant application process for local entities.
 - (b) The Institute for Digital Health and Innovation shall:
 - (1) Determine Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund grantees;
 - (2) Promulgate rules necessary to implement this act;
- (3)(A) Determine the amount of the Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund grant funds disbursed to an applicant.
- (B) An applicant may be a prospective and qualified applicant for a federal grant or loan for a broadband development program under the federal regulations promulgated by the Federal Communications Commission, the United States Department of Agriculture, or other federal agency;
 - (4) Make the determination if the grants shall be awarded; and
- (5) Inform the Treasurer of State when a determination is made for the awarding of Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund grants.
- (c) The Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund grants awarded under this act shall:
 - (1) Not exceed seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) per grant;
 - (2) Be limited to thirty (30) total one-time grant awards; and
- (3) Be made to a federally deposit-insured financial institution designated by the local entity that is a Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund grantee.

- (d)(1) A local entity that is a Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund grantee shall:
- (A) Manage the funds it receives for conducting the broadband due-diligence business studies; and
- (B) File with the Institute for Digital Health and Innovation of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences an audited accounting of disbursed funds for conducting the broadband due-diligence business studies, including information concerning the organizations conducting the broadband due-diligence business studies, the amount paid to those organizations, and the due date of the broadband due-diligence business studies.
- (2) The accounting described in subdivision (d)(1)(B) of this section shall be filed no later than:
 - (A)(i) Four (4) months from the date of receipt of the funds.
- (ii) A local entity that files an accounting filed under subdivision (d)(2)(A)(i) of this section shall file an additional accounting at the conclusion of the broadband due-diligence business study; or
 - (B) Nine (9) months after receipt of the funds.
- (3) Any funds not spent on the broadband due-diligence business study shall be paid back to the Treasurer of State within nine (9) months after receipt of the disbursement.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021.

SECTION 29. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. LEGISLATIVE OVERSIGHT.

- (a) The General Assembly shall maintain oversight of the Rural Broadband
 I.D. Expenses Trust Fund grant program under this act by requiring prior approval of
 the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by law before Rural
 Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund grants are awarded.
- (b) The Director of the Institute for Digital Health and Innovation of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences and the Treasurer of State, or their designees, shall:
- (1) Report to the General Assembly before Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund grants are awarded;
 - (2)(A) File an semiannual report detailing:
- (i) The balance of the Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses

 Trust Fund as of the reporting date;
- (ii) A list of the administrative overhead costs paid for from the Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund; and
- (iii) A detailed description of the grant applications received and the amount of the Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund grant funds that were disbursed.

- (B) The semiannual reports required under subdivision (b)(2)(A) of this section shall be submitted by January 1 and July 1 of each year to the:
 - (i) Governor;
- (ii) Legislative Council or, if the General Assembly is in session, the Joint Budget Committee; and
- (iii) Joint Committee on Advanced Communications and Information Technology.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021.

SECTION 30. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. INVESTMENT OF FUNDS.

- (a)(1) The Treasurer of State shall invest the moneys available in the Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund.
- (2) The investment of funds under this section is exempt from § 19-3-518(a)(2)(B)(i)(b) and (c).
- (b) Moneys in the Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund may be invested in any instrument that is:
 - (1) Listed in § 19-3-518(b)(1)(B); and
- (2) Approved by the guidelines established by the State Treasury investment policy approved by the State Board of Finance.
- (c) Assuming reauthorization of the Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust
 Fund by the General Assembly, moneys remaining in the Rural Broadband I.D.
 Expenses Trust Fund at the end of each fiscal year shall carry forward and be made available for the purposes stated in this section in the next fiscal year.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021.

SECTION 31. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. <u>ADDITIONAL REPORTING REQUIREMENT BY LOCAL ENTITY AS RURAL BROADBAND I.D. EXPENSES TRUST FUND GRANTEE.</u>

A local entity that is a Rural Broadband I.D. Expenses Trust Fund grantee under this act shall:

Senator Bob Ballinger offered an amendment to HB1016, striking language that allows the state to institute a civil action against a regional solid waste management district to seek recovery of funds expended from the Landfill Post Closure Trust Fund. That amendment was adopted.

One of the districts this could benefit is the Northwest Arkansas Regional Solid Waste Management District. I am employed by a bank that owns bonds issued by this entity which are in default. By the state giving up any claims it has against the district, there could be more funds available at some point for bondholders. Although I am told the amendment does not affect bondholders, out of an abundance of caution, I will abstain from debating or voting on HB1016 as amended.
