# GLOSSARY

---

**ACHM** – Asphalt Concrete Hot Mix

**Bridge and Approaches** – Constructing bridge structures and sections leading up to the bridge

**Calendar day contract** – Contract where the number of calendar days are bid

**CAP** – Connecting Arkansas Program

**CPM** -- Critical Path Method—A step-by-step project management technique that identifies critical activities that must be completed before the next stage can proceed.

**(F)** – Project with Federal Oversight

**Grading and Structures** – Earthwork and bridge construction; “structures” includes bridges and drainage structures

**Interchange** – Improvements to the junction between two or more roadways, typically including an overpass or bridge with associated ramps

**IRP** – Interstate Rehabilitation Program

**Major Widening** – Widening of an existing roadway to improve capacity or enhance safety, generally by adding a lane or lanes

**New Location** – Construction of a roadway on a location not previously developed for vehicular transportation

**PCC Pavement** – Portland Cement Concrete Pavement

**Reconstruction** – Generally, removing an existing roadway and building a new road in the same place

**Rehabilitation** – Modifying or improving an existing roadway; generally less costly and less time consuming than a full reconstruction

**Resurfacing** – Installation or application of a new driving surface; could be an overlay, sealing job, or similar procedure

**(S)** – Project with State Oversight

**Safety and Traffic Engineering** – Various improvements to enhance safety and/or improve traffic flow

**Working Day Contract** – Contract for which time will be assessed for each day on which conditions allow the Contractor to work per Standard Specification for Highway Construction 108.06

The contractor is now in that portion of work and is limited as to what work can be progressed along Hwy. 71B. Relocation of utilities is just about complete but has caused an additional delay to the contractor in the schedule of work.*

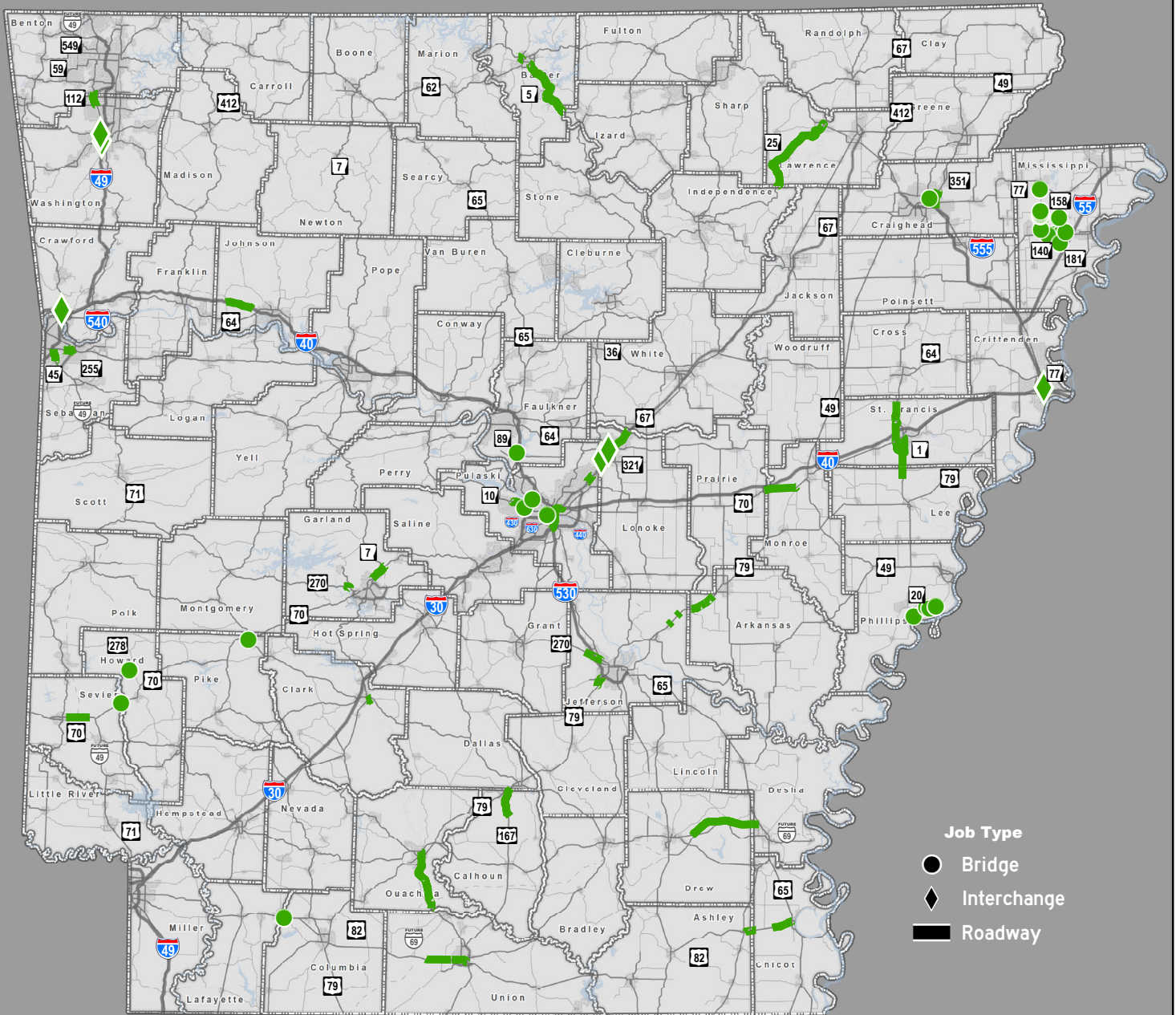

24 Officer of the State may transfer funds from the ~~Arkansas Rainy Day Fund~~ Long  
25 Term Reserve Fund in the event a “revenue shortfall” exists to meet the  
26 state’s financial obligation to provide an adequate educational system for  
27 the state and to provide for the effective operation of state government. In  
28 the event the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State determines that a “revenue  
29 shortfall” exists as defined as a circumstance when the official forecast of  
30 gross general revenue certified by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State is  
31 projected to increase less than three percent (3%) over and above the gross  
32 general revenue collections of the previous fiscal year due to changes in  
33 economic conditions, he or she may then transfer funds from the ~~Arkansas~~  
34 ~~Rainy Day Fund~~ Long Term Reserve Fund, as approved by the Legislative Council  
35 or Joint Budget Committee, to various funds and fund accounts, as deemed  
36 necessary, in the Revenue Stabilization Law for the purpose of meeting

1 unanticipated shortfalls in state general revenue.

2 (2) Or the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State may transfer funds  
3 from the ~~Arkansas Rainy Day Fund~~ Long Term Reserve Fund to the Economic  
4 Development Superprojects Project Fund for projects authorized under Arkansas  
5 Constitution, Amendment 82, as approved by the Governor and the Legislative  
6 Council or Joint Budget Committee.

7 (3) Determining the maximum amount of appropriation and general  
8 revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year is the prerogative of the  
9 General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums  
10 in the appropriation acts for a state agency and the general revenue  
11 allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by amendment to the

32 shall instruct the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State to prepare and submit  
33 written documentation to the Legislative Council or the Joint Budget  
34 Committee. Such documentation shall include:

 22 Central Services Fund, there to be used for the purposes specified for ~~the~~

 25 SECTION 19. Arkansas Code § 27-65-107(a), concerning the powers and  
 26 duties of the State Highway Commission, is amended to add additional  
 27 subdivisions to read as follows:

29 (i) Criteria for distribution of funds and the  
 30 distribution of funds from the:

31 (a) State Highway and Transportation

6 Auditor of State the sum of forty million dollars (\$40,000,000) from the  
7 funds available in the Rainy Day Set-Aside of the 90<sup>th</sup> Session Projects  
8 Account of the General Improvement Fund as authorized by Acts 2015, No. 1147,  
9 § 3(a)(11), to the Arkansas Highway Transfer Fund there to be used only for  
10 the purposes set forth in § 19-6-832.

11 (b) Disbursement of funds authorized by this act shall be limited to  
12 the appropriation for the agency and funds made available by law for the

20 (c) It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed  
21 under the authority of this act shall be in compliance with the stated

23 Executive Recommendations, and Legislative Recommendations contained in the  
24 budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration,  
25 letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the  
26 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and  
27 adoption.

29 SECTION 22. EFFECTIVE DATE. Sections 9-12, 14, 16 and 17 of this act  
30 are effective on and after July 1, 2017.

31  
32 SECTION 23. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the  
33 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that Arkansas bridges and roads are  
34 in need of repair and proper maintenance; that the repair and proper  
35 maintenance of Arkansas bridges and roads are necessary for the preservation  
36 of the public peace, health, and safety; that increased funding is essential

1 to the repair and proper maintenance of Arkansas bridges and roads; that this  
2 act is designed to provide the necessary funding that is essential to the  
3 repair and proper maintenance of Arkansas bridges and roads, and this act is  
4 necessary because without this increased funding, the repair and proper  
5 maintenance of Arkansas bridges and roads may not be performed. Therefore, an  
6 emergency is declared to exist, and Sections 1-8, 13, 15, 18-21 of this act  
7 being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health,  
8 and safety shall become effective on July 1, 2016.
