His first Senate term began in 2019. Before his election to the Senate, he served in the House of Representatives from 2011 through 2018. In the House, he was *Minority Leader* for six years.

Senator Leding, a graduate of the University of Arkansas, works in graphic and web design. He is a native of Springdale.

He and his wife, Emily, have a daughter.

Senator Leding is vice chair of the Senate Committee on City, County and Local Affairs. He is a member of the Senate Judiciary Committee, the Joint Budget Committee, the Joint Committee on Public Retirement and Social Security Systems and the Legislative Joint Auditing Committee.

During the 2019 legislative session, Senator Leding co-sponsored legislation to raise teacher salaries, to expand insurance coverage for mammograms and breast cancer diagnoses, to promote cottage industries and to raise the minimum legal age for getting married.
