9	TO COMMEMORATE THE NINETY-FOURTH ANNIVERSARY OF THE
10	UNITED STATES SUPREME COURT RULING IN MOORE V.

15	TO COMMEMORATE THE NINETY-FOURTH
16	ANNIVERSARY OF THE UNITED STATES SUPREME
17	COURT RULING IN MOORE V. DEMPSEY.

20	WHEREAS, the Elaine Massacre was a riot that began on September 30,
21	1919, at Hoop Spur near Elaine, Arkansas; and
22	
23	WHEREAS, an estimated one hundred (100) to two hundred thirty-seven
24	(237) African Americans were killed, along with five (5) white men; and
25	
26	WHEREAS, the Elaine Massacre is considered the deadliest race riot in
27	the State of Arkansas and among the deadliest racial conflicts in all of
28	United States history; and
29	
30	WHEREAS, the Elaine 12 were twelve (12) African American men who were
31	sentenced to death, some of whom for murder and others as accessories to
32	murder of Clinton Lee, a white man; and
33	
34	WHEREAS, following the convictions of the Elaine 12, the National
35	Association for the Advancement of Colored People filed two (2) lawsuits, one
36	of which resulted in the United States Supreme Court decision in Moore $v_{\:\raisebox{1pt}{\text{\circle*{1.5}}}}$



1	Dempsey; and

3	WHEREAS, on February 19, 1923, the United States Supreme Court declared
4	in Moore v. Dempsey that state rulings could be challenged in federal court
5	to determine if criminal defendants had been denied their federal
6	constitutional rights; and
7	
8	WHEREAS, Moore v. Dempsey was the first in a string of United States
9	Supreme Court rulings that expanded the meaning of the Due Process Clause
10	over the Twentieth Century; and
11	
12	WHEREAS, in recognition of this landmark decision, the new Legacy
13	Center in Elaine, Arkansas, honored the Elaine 12 at its inaugural event in
14	Elaine on Friday, February 17, 2017, just days before the ninety-fourth
15	anniversary of the Moore v. Dempsey case,
16	
17	NOW THEREFORE,
18	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE NINETY-FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE
19	STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:
20	
21	THAT the Ninety-First General Assembly recognizes the historical
22	importance of the Elaine Massacre and commemorates the ninety-fourth
23	anniversary of the United States Supreme Court ruling in Moore v. Dempsey, a
24	landmark ruling that changed the nature of the Due Process Clause of the
25	Fourteenth Amendment.

27	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT upon adoption of this resolution, the Secretary
28	of the Senate transmit a copy to the Legacy Center in Elaine, Arkansas.
